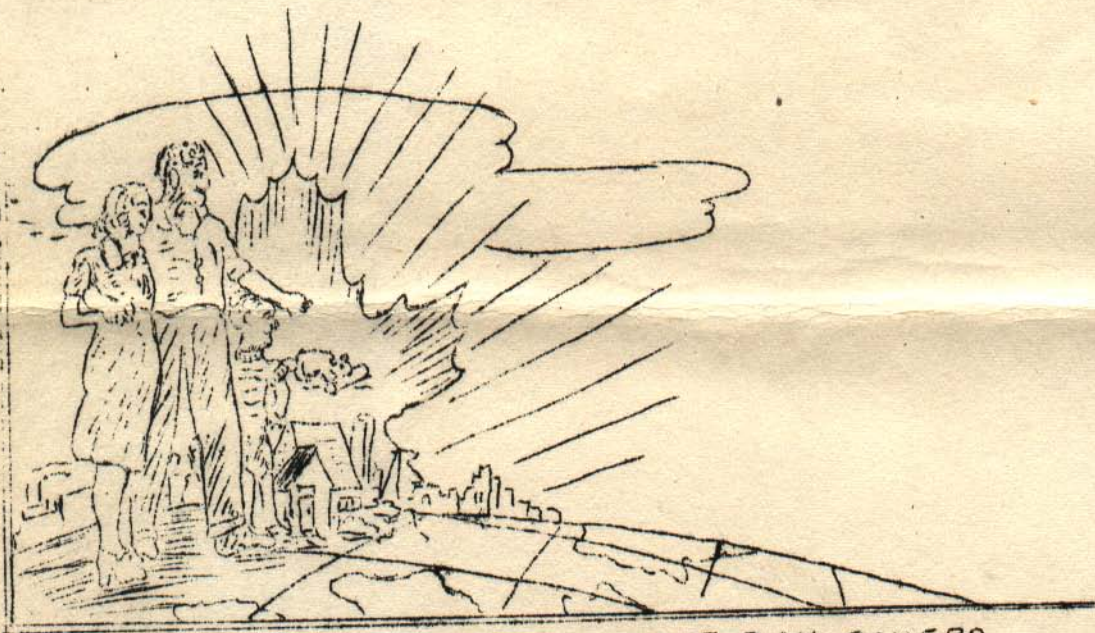

Cachet Design for C. P. S. FIRST DAY COVERS.

"Second New Canadian Stamp To Be Issued This Year"

The Post Office Department has announced that a special stamp will be issued on Tuesday, July 1st, to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of Confederation and the birth of "Canadian Citizenship." The design is as illustrated above and the color will likely be blue as is the "Bell" issue. The size of this stamp will be approximately that of the 10-cent stamp of 1942 showing the Parliament Buildings. Printing will be in sheets of 50 and the stamp will be current for about three months.

First Day Covers may be sent to the Postmaster at Ottawa for cancellation. Stamps may be obtained direct from the Philatelic Division at Ottawa. All remittances to be made payable to the Receiver-General of Canada.

OFFICIAL C. P. S. FIRST DAY COVERS with BI-COLOR CACHET.

The Canadian Philatelic Society has prepared an attractive cachet to be printed in two colors which will be available to all collectors. The design is sketched above but cannot show the beauty of the original Two-color Cachet. These will be mailed from Ottawa, July 1st, through the co-operation of the Ottawa Philatelic Society, which is affiliated with the C.P.S.

The price for First Day Cacheted Covers will be 10¢ apiece for singles, with a minimum of three to an order. Blocks will be supplied at 25¢ each, or 3 for 65¢. Larger orders pro-rata.

All orders with remittances shall be sent to the Executive-Secretary, P. J. McCabe, 40 Stanley Ave., Mimico, Toronto 14, Ont. not later than June 25.

Other new issues of interest will appear in the United States this summer. On June 9 there will be a Doctor's Commemorative issued at Atlantic City. July 12th will be the first day for the Mormon-Utah Commemorative Stamp. Yet to be officially announced are 10¢, 15¢ and 25¢ air mail stamps and a 10¢ airmail letter sheet.

From the Canadian Revenue Society Bulletin we note that the Department of Customs and Excise is now handling orders for stamps for collectors at its headquarters instead of through the port of Ottawa. Requests for stamps should be addressed to L. A. White, Department of National Revenue, Customs and Excise, Connaught Building, Ottawa, Ont. Requests should be accompanied by money orders payable to the Receiver-General of Canada. Tax Pairs are not sold.

From the same source we learn that Canada recently issued its first stamp especially for the collection of the excise tax on Playing Cards.

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The C.P.S. Directors have initiated proceedings to form a District Association in the city of Toronto and Suburbs. The plan was presented to the meeting at the Royal York Hotel on May 2nd. At the last meeting there on May 30th a Committee of approximately twenty delegates from the clubs of the district was appointed under Herb. Buckland, as Chairman pro-tem. They will draw up a plan for the District Association to comprise all collectors in the Toronto area.

It is also hoped that similar associations may be formed in other larger areas in the near future.
