CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP STAMP ISSUED JULY 1st.

The C.P.S. sent out close to five thousand First Day Covers to its members and other collectors. There is already quite a demand for used copies of this issue.

While we deplore the type of publicity the Press gave recent new issues in Canada it apparently resulted in a last minute overhaul of the latest design between the time the photographs were issued to the press and the production of the stamps. The illustration used on the last Bulletin clearly showed many differences from the issued stamp. The words "Postes-Postage" were moved and the figure of a "typical citizen" (?) was turned to hide his dirty ear from the "lady of the press" at Ottawa. We hope that Uncle Joe won't think that all of us have but three fingers. The design is better for the white lines added around the lettering and those about the main and bottom panels. Our information from Ottawa is that no further changes are contemplated.

In the Ottawa Citizen we read that the suggestion of new Canadian Stamps for the Wedding of the Princess, and also their Tour of this country have not been denied but answered with "Maybe Both".

Another item has been taken off sale at Ottawa, namely J7, the 2¢ Due. The quantity of "17¢ Errors" printed is reported by Gladish as being 300,000 of Die I. This he compares with 20,000 of the 10¢ surcharged Spec. Deliv. of '39 now selling around two-bits.

Those who look for "Hidden Dates" will find it above the tip of Labrador.

FIRST DAY COVER FANS may be interested in obtaining C.P.S. covers on hand. The Exec-Secretary has a small supply of each of the last three. Members may obtain these as long as the supply lasts at: Citizen F.D.C.'s-Singles 2/25¢, Blocks 30¢; Bells or 7¢ Airmail (from Sudbury) at 20¢. Prices to non-members are 15¢ & 35¢ and 25¢ for the last two.

Our Directors have resolved that in the future complaints and suggestions to the Postmaster General or the Philatelic Branch should be forwarded thru our Exec-Secretary so that united action by all clubs may be taken and then present them to the proper place thru our representative in Ottawa.

A plan is being prepared to offer a Service to Members for the "Mounting Cataloging and Pricing" of such stamps as the members may not care to take care of themselves. The small fee involved would be just such as would cover the cost of the handling. Thus much more material could be put into the Sales Circuit. The members reaction to this is solicited. "P.J.McCabe".
