C.P.S. BULLETIN We will issue our next Bulletin, November 1st in a printed booklet of pocket size. In order to provide for a most interesting publication, we will for the ensuing year print C.P.S. Bulletin bi-monthly. Members are privileged to insert Classified ads - wants, etc. - 2¢ per word, each issue. We are setting up an Affiliated Club Directory wherein local clubs may register their names of officers, place and time of meetings. The cost will be approximately \$1.00 per issue or 6 issues for \$5.00, and we hope that all clubs will take advantage of this opportunity to advertise their meetings so that visiting members may call on them while in their city or town. Reports and news items should be in the hands of the Editor before the middle of October.

Imprinted Air Letter forms are now sold at face value by the Post Office. There is a 10¢ blue, and a 15¢ red. Gladish reports from Ottawa that two varieties of the 10¢ have already appeared. A violet-blue produced at Ottawa has the imprint "no enclosure permitted" in lower case letters, while a gray-violet shade produced at Montreal uses capital letters. The watermark on the first is vertical and on the latter runs sideways.

The Royal Wedding of Princess Elizabeth on November 20th has not yet brought any announcement of new stamps although they have been hinted at. If such word is released, this Society will immediately have an announcement for its members regarding First Day Covers.

A Mailmat was in operation at the Toronto Exhibition this year with a special slogan used in the cancellation, reading: "Mailed at the Canadian National Exhibition, Toronto". Meter No. 51002 was used. The Mailmat is a coin-operated Mail Box, which shows the amount of money put in and is set for any value desired for each piece mailed. The cancellation is automatically applied and your mail dropped into the box to await collection.

The Br. Col. Phil. Soc. report keen competition around the Stamp Exhibits at the first postwar Pacific National Exhibition in Vancouver the first week of this month. Gold and Silver Medals went to H. G. Whittaker of Victoria (Sudan) and J. G. Wylie of Vancouver (Gt. Britain) respectively. Capt. Binks also displayed his Canadian Cover which won a 4th prize at the CIPEX. On Oct. 23rd. the B. C. P. S. will entertain the Royal City Club when the Stripp Trophy will be awarded for the most points in the open class.
