Kendall McNeill of the Ottawa Philatelic Soc. has sent us a booklet he has prepared for the Canadian Legion Educational Services on Stamp Collecting. It is worthy of reprinting for the C.P.S. for use of new collectors. The Ottawa Club are going ahead with plans for visiting the local hospitals, assisting veterans in getting collections going.

The Canadian Philatelic Society Annual Exhibition.

The Committee wish to announce the following rules and regulations for the entry of exhibits for competition:

1. Each exhibit shall be entered in its proper class and any exhibit incorrectly entered may be transferred to the proper section by the Committee. Exhibits may be entered as "Not for Competition".
2. No exhibit may be removed prior to the close of the exhibition.
3. The decision of the Judges shall be final and they shall have full power to withhold an award where in the opinion there is insufficient competition or for any other reason which makes it seem desirable to do so.
4. The Judging Jury will make the awards in each class, basing them on a consideration of the following qualifications: I. Philatelic Knowledge, II. Condition, III. Completeness, IV. Arrangement & Neatness.
5. Exhibits will be mounted during the day and evening preceding the exhibit.
6. Entries to close, and exhibits to reach the committee at a date to be set.
7. It is earnestly requested that all those intending to exhibit, send full particulars to the Exhibition Committee in order that a list of all exhibitors may be made.
8. A Grand Trophy will be awarded for the exhibit of outstanding philatelic merit. A Special Award will be given for the best arranged, annotated and mounted collection in the exhibition.
9. Classification of Exhibits: I. Canada (a) General. (b) Covers; II. Great Britain & Colonies; III. Foreign; IV. Airmail (a) General (b) Covers; V. Junior (a) Beginner. (b) Advanced; VI. Special, - any collection or subject matter not otherwise classified; VII. Non-members.
10. Judges: J. N. Sissons (Can.) L. A. Davenport (G. B. & Col.) Dr. Maresch (For.).

Cox, who is in the hospital at present. Colored Movies completed the program.

The B.C. Phil. Soc. has now reached its membership quota of 75. Geo. Stripp has donated a handsome gold shield for annual competition between members of the B.C.P.S. and the Royal City Stamp Club of New Westminster, B.C.

The Wascana Phil. Soc. report a Junior Section now under way in charge of a regular boys man, Bert Gray. This season's weekly auctions have netted well over \$250.00. The first lady visitor was recently welcomed among 20 odd men.

The Saskatoon Stamp Club have elected Fred Catteral as Vice-President. It is mighty nice to see a 17 year old Junior step into a senior position. Members have donated material for an auction Dec. 5th., all proceeds of which are to go to the A.C.T. Tuberculosis Preventative Fund.

East Toronto Stamp Club's Foreign Exhibition included 40 frames and a cover from China bearing \$64,000. worth of stamps. Winners were: 1st, W. J. Cafley-Belgium; 2nd, H. F. Nicolle-U.S.A.; 3rd, M. Jenson-France. Covers: 1st, F. Morgan; 2nd Miss Laine. Judging was done by members from the North Toronto Club, Messrs. Burchard, Barclay and Freeman.

West Toronto Stamp Club's Ladies Night was a definite success with about a hundred members and friends present. A programme of games, music and horse-trading was enjoyed individually and collectively.

The Lakeshore Club's Junior Section had 16 on hand before the senior meeting. J.M. Lawler reported on the plans of the Mimico Recreation Council Commission with which the club is co-operating.

The Grand River Valley Association held its November meeting in Guelph "Y" with the largest turnout yet recorded. President J. Graham of the Guelph Stamp Club welcomed the visitors. A brisk silent auction of a hundred items was held. The evenings prize winners were: O. Peer, Guelph; B. Hasler, Brantford; Wm. Erbach and Milt Good of Kitchener. Members from Elmira, Galt, Preston and Paris were also in attendance.

The Brantford Stamp Club are providing experienced guidance for a new Junior Club which was mentioned on the radio the other night. The meetings usual "swap, sell and gossip" period was followed by a Quiz and a Stampo game.

The 10th Anniversary of the Welland Stamp Club was well attended, with visitors present from Waterloo, Toronto, Oakville, Hamilton, and Niagara Falls N.Y. One of the outstanding exhibits was a collection of France by C.E. Griffin. Mr. O. Clements contributes an excellent column to his paper, the Welland Evening Tribune. Following a dinner at the Rita Hotel, an auction was held. Mr. Ed. Goodale, of Hamilton, gave an historical talk about the Niagara Peninsula.
