The thanks of this society are due in no small way to Miss Mae Hanselman, President of the Brantford Stamp Club, and to Mr. and Mrs. E. D. Taylor, who performed the lion's share of the labor associated with the handling of this enormous task.

We understand that the Brantford Post Office where snowed under for days before all the requests received could be complied with. By this time most of you will however have received yours and are all agreeing that the Canadian Post Office has turned out a really commendable job. This size of the stamp may not make it a popular stamp for heavy postage users but it will be eagerly picked up by collectors with an eye to its future value.
