C. P. S. Annual Meeting, April 11th.

This year there was no election necessary as the eight required Directors were elected by acclamation.

Mr. McCabe's Financial Report was favorably received and will appear in the Year Book which will be published very soon.

Each of the members of the Executive outlined this year's activities. A Delegate from each Affiliated Club present gave a report of their year's work.

Mr Heenan stressed the need to move Sales Circuit more rapidly in view of the increased demand for books. A limit of three days for inspection is set.

Mr Buckland reported that as of March 31st. the membership rolls stood at 985 but as of April 11th there were 1003 members in the C.P.S. This includes the latest affiliation of the Acme Screw & Gear Co. at Weston, 100% membership.

Mr Baulch outlined the success of the Bell issue from Brantford, in co-operation with the C.P.S. Affiliate, The Brantford Stamp Club. This club's share of the proceeds derived from First Day Covers being a hundred dollars. The numerous contacts made will afford a fine opportunity to boost our new drive for C.P.S. members. Sales of stamps at Brantford wickets on March 3rd ran 132,700 which with 286,172 Covers serviced by the Post Office resulted in the sales for the day of 418,872 new Bell stamps.

Mr Christianson spoke of the assistance being given to numerous inquiries on behalf of Junior Stamp Clubs. He mentioned the hope that a collection of reproductions of outstanding items from the leading collections might be formed for general study.

Mr Chas.L.Brisley, of Bloomingdale, Mich., the #1 C.P.S. "Booster" in the U.S.A. greeted the club and offered his collection of over two hundred slides to the C.P.S. Library to establish a club collection.

Mr Fred Jarret, the Honorary President of the C.P.S. also offered his collection as a further donation to the C.P.S. collection.

Also present were Mr Norman Clark, newly elected Director from Windsor, and Col. Rer Hawkins, who flew down from Winnipeg to attend the meeting.

The C. P. S. Annual BANQUET.

This year's Annual Banquet was attended by over one hundred and fifty members who enjoyed a memorable evening. The Guest Speaker was Mr. Robson Lowe of London, England. Mr Lowe described the Calton Portrait and his daughter passed out miniature copies to the guests. This view of Queen Victoria was painted by Albert Edward Chalon, R.A., in 1337 as a gift to her Prince Consort. Two copies were made, one for the King of Prussia and another for the King of Portugal. This later is now in the possession of Robson Lowe, the whereabouts of the others being unknown. This portrait was used for the design of various British stamps for 62 years including Canada's 12 d. Black. Mr Lowe told of the British Philatelic Association and the Postal History Society. The latter holds it's convention at varying places each year and are hoping to come to Canada for their conference in 1950. Tribute was paid to the late Fred J. Melville, whose many writings have enriched our Philatelic shelves. A Fund is being established in his memory, the proceeds to be used for annual awards for meritorious Philatelic efforts, and to reprint the most important of his works. Contributions would be welcomed through our C.P.S. President for this fund. Mr Lowe told how hard it was to make his clothing coupons "go around" with the result that before setting out on this tour he purchased suits without vests and supplemented this item by remaking the material which he found in his Mother's black brocaded dress. He proudly displayed his waistcoat made from her old dress. During the evening Mr Lowe was called on to make the Lucky Draw and to present the various awards.

The President's Prize to the one bringing in the most new members during the year were announce as going to: 1st.- E.D.Taylor, Brantford (8); 2nd.- W.Allendorf, Kitchener (7); 3rd.- W.A.Teare, Edmonton (6).

The three awards for the Sponsor of a new member during each of the three contests during the year were drawn by the following: Tom McGeachy, Toronto; James I.Keary, New Westminster, B.C.; and the final one went to L.Johns, of Timmins. Each of these men will receive a complete set of Br.Col. Victories.

The Annual Lucky Draw was made by Mr Robson Lowe who drew three names from the barrel to win valuable prize sets for 1.- Miss Beaton, Toronto; 2.- Col. Reg. Hawkins, Winnipeg; and 3.- P.Bond, Toronto. This last ticket was sold by Col Hawkins to a former Winnipegite, and incidently the Colonel signed up Mr Bond for the C.P.S. during the evening.

Club Reports

The final C.P.S. Debate was held March 28th at the Royal York Hotel, Toronto with the Lakeshore Stamp Club taking their third annual victory, from the Mutual Stamp Club on the subject "Resolved that it is better to collect 19th. Century than 20th Century Stamps, with the Lakeshore upholding the earlier stamps. Lakeshore debaters were Messrs. McCabe, Bairstow and Lawlor while their opponents were Messrs. Cafley, Nicolle and Stevens. Judging was 60% for Material, 40% for Delivery; either being marked Excellent, Good, Average, Mediocre or Poor. This system is faster and more simple than previous ones.

The B.C. Philatelic Society announce that with the retirement of Capt. B.C. Binks from their Presidency that the new officers are C.S. Neville, as President Geo. Stripp, Vice-Pres. and C. Frank Parks (our correspondent) as Secretary This club is now over 50% affiliated with the C.P.S. and more in sight. (C.F.P.)

The Grand River Philatelic Association met this month in Galt to place host to the London collectors. About fifteen Londoners were on hand plus yours truly who attended the London Collegiate once upon-a-time. A large number of the ladies from each club were present and an interesting discussion of the Bell stamp took place. Among the Prize winners of the evening was a visitor, Mrs Favro of the Lakeshore Club at Mimico.

The Toronto Stamp Collectors Club have returned all of last years officers under the Presidency of Walter S. Bayley. The Club are putting a combined exhibit in the Centenary International Exhibition in New York.

The Brantford Stamp Club have extended an invitation to the C.P.S. to hold their next annual Meeting and "Convention" in Brantford in 1948.

New Issues and Old

Assurance is forthcoming that the Canadian Post Office Department will issue Commemorative stamps July 1st for the 80th. Anniversary of Confederation as intimated in the Ottawa Evening Citizen. The form which they will take has yet to be decided, but it is possible they will supply the low values not included in the recent new issue. (W.M. Gladish.)

Since this is the first time that this holiday is to be known as "Canada Day" there may be added significance to this fact. (H.B.)

The United States will issue these: Apr. 29 - 10¢ Letter Sheet, May 17 - 3¢ Centenary, May 19 - 15¢ Souvenir Sheet, May 21 - 5¢ Centenary Air Mail Envelope, June -- Geo. Wash. Carver Commemorative, July (24) - Mormon Centenary.

The States have also announced the discontinuance of the 4¢ and all values from the 10¢ to 25¢ except the 10, 15, 20 & 25¢ stamps.

An AP despatch announces a U.S. 3¢ Doctors of America Commem, June 9th.

"50¢ Off at Ottawa"

The very latest is that the 50¢ King George V. stamp of 1912 is finally off the list of the Philatelic Division in Ottawa. This is Scott's No. 121. (W.M.G.)

We have a notice of the receipt of a limited number of stamps which have been issued by the Swiss Government and which will be valid only for the special flight of the Swissair Company between Switzerland and New York, scheduled for May 2, 1947. These may be obtained by sending .75¢ per stamp to the Minister of Switzerland, Legation of Switzerland in Canada, Ottawa. They come in sheets of 25 stamps, not obliterated.

J.F.Babb of Galt reports the following numbers issued from South Africa of the Royal Visit Issue: 1d.-122,500 sheet(x240), 2d. 241,500 sheets(x120) off cylinder #6912, and 289,102 sheets off cylinder #39 with the 3d. having only 47,000 sheets (x120).

There are three stamps on which A.G.Bell has appeared. The U.S. 10¢ in the Famous American Series is well known but how many have seen the Bell stamp from the Argentine, which was issued in 1944 for the benefit of the Argentine Postal Employees? It is a Semi-Postal but bears Bell's Picture. The Editor is grateful to Comte Henri De Gourville, of Buenos Aires for a copy.

Watch this month for the release of new stamps from the Union Islands (Tokelau) where Western Samoan stamps have been in use.

Australia is reported to be issuing a Princess Elizabeth stamp for the birthday of the Heir-apparent. (W.M.G.)

Library Additions

"A History of Wreck Covers", by A.E.Hopkins; A most interesting book describing covers salvaged from wrecked ships, and includes 17 plates of pictures of these very interesting items.

Talks about Postage Stamps - A.E.Hopkins. This book was written for two reasons; - i. To provide an account of some of the activities of the Bristol and Clifton Philatelic Society, and ii. To give in short readable form, an insight into the very great interest which attaches to collectors of stamps.

Essays of Martin Schroeder of Leipzig - described by B.A.R. in volume of Frankfurt (1903). The text of this book is in German, but it contains 438 photographic pictures of essays and is really a most interesting compilation of these philatelic pieces of European countries.

These books mentioned are gratefully acknowledged as the gift of Mr.F.Hugh Vallancy of Sidcup, Kent, England, to whom we offer our sincere thanks.

Wichmann's German - English Dictionary - 5th Edition We appreciate this gift to our library from Jim Stephen of Toronto.

The Story of "Tekkoku-Kofuru" the 10 sen stamp of Japan which made its appearance at Nagoya on May 1st, 1945. This most interesting story written by our Capt.Wm.H.Talbot of Winnipeg is published in its entirety in "Philately" of Dec.30, 1946 and an autographed copy presented to our C.P.S. library by Capt. Talbot to whom we extend our grateful thanks. (Bert.Nicolle.)

America's Stamps, by Maude and Miska Petersham, published by The Macmillan Co. This is "The Story of One Hundred Years of U.S. Postage Stamps". It shows a large illustration of every stamp issued in that time, accompanied by numerous timely drawings by Mr. Petersham illustrate the events the various stamp issues commemorated. The text contains facts and information of such general interest that every collector will want to read it all through. We note that there seems to be more outstandingly new material presented therein than in the average publication. The Philatelic Foundation of New York have approved all that this excellent work presents. Once seen you will want this in your own Philatelic Library if you collect the stamps of the U.S.A.
