JOIN C.P.S.**

We welcome this month to Affiliation in the Canadian Philatelic Society, three new clubs. The first is the R-A Stamp Club of Ottawa Civil Service Recreational Association. They meet each Wednesday in the Association Lounge. Our Assistant Editor, W. M. Gladish has been the first Honorary Member elected. The second is the Cape Breton Philatelic Society whom we gladly welcome from the Maritimes. The third is The Oakville Philatelic Society which is the result of growth from the Junior Stamp Club whose first graduates have now turned to senior ranks and drawn together enough to start another club. The O.P.S. includes C.P.S. membership in their own fees. Thus we have another 100% C.P.S. Club.

**CAPEX 1951**

In the year 1851 Canada issued its first Postage Stamps. These were designed by Sir Sanford Fleming in the city of Toronto. More about this story will be told at a later date. The consensus of opinion has been that Toronto should logically be the spot to celebrate the Centennary of this event. Action was started by this Society nearly a year ago which has culminated in the securing of the charter recently of the Canadian Association for Philatelic Exhibitions Inc. Organization is proceeding and you will have read the list of officers in Popular Stamps. Prominent men from all parts of the country are joining the Directorate along with others from outside Canada. We can indeed look forward to an excellent International exhibition in 1951. In that year the Toronto Stamp Collectors Club expect to entertain the A.P.S. Convention since they are Canadian Chapter No. 1. It is fitting therefore that the officers of the C.P.S. and the T.S.C.C. should share in the direction of the CAPEX for 1951.

**ON TO BRANTFORD**

Yes. Brantford has been selected as the city in which the C.P.S. Annual Meeting, Convention, Exhibition and Banquet will be held on April 16-17, 1948. To show what Brantford can do they have invited the Toronto District Union to be the guests of the Brantford Stamp Club and the Grand River Philatelic Society at an Exhibition and Bourse followed by a Dinner, in the Kirby House on Saturday, November 15th. The speaker will be Charles L. Brisley. The exhibit will be open to all who wish to bring a frame. The T.D.U. have chartered a bus, so now it's "On to Brantford."

The new Australian Penny Stamp with the portrait of Princess Elizabeth will be released on November 20th, the date of the Princess's wedding. It will replace the present stamp picturing Queen Elizabeth.

**THE NEW  
SCOTT'S 1948 CATALOGUE  
B.N.A. ISSUES  
By Aubrey Kelson**

The new edition of Scott's brings many welcome changes. Collectors should be well satisfied with the many increases in the B.N.A. listings this year, eliminating of course the old Provinces which have not moved. Most issues from 1851 to the present time show improvement in increased values, this will give heart to the many collectors of Canada. Newfoundland enthusiasts will also derive more than ordinary pleasure from the many increases listed, for in the matter of quantity of items from the Guy issues onwards this country has been heavily re-priced.

Having been subjected to only desultory changes during the past twenty years, Scott's this year appears as though someone has at last taken hold. It may be the new owners of this publication will in future give us a work more dependable in values than at any time during the past quarter of a century.

A few errors in the Canadian listings occur, but these will be adjusted shortly when corrections are published in the October Scott's Monthly.

It has been the writer's task for the past ten years to note every change in British Empire listings from the old to the new edition of Scott's. Up to the time of writing only a few countries have been surveyed and it appears as though there are many remarkable changes this year.

Any catalogue which is used as extensively as Scott's is in this country is an unwelcome publication when it is a continual source of controversy between dealer and client. It does appear however that this year's edition will satisfy both collectors and dealers. The many changes will do a great deal towards popularizing the catalogue.

As has been said and written so often before, the catalogue is a tremendous undertaking and requires experience and understanding of values from so many different angles. It is therefore most encouraging to note with the change of ownership of Scott's that special attention is being given to pricing as to-day's market conditions demand.
