INTRODUCING A NEW C.P.S. SERVICE

This is the first issue of a new publication of the Society which will appear 11 times a year as a Supplement to our Official Magazine - "THE CANADIAN PHILATELIST". The publication of a high quality magazine is a costly proposition, so much so that your Directors find that at the moment it is not economically practical to issue it more often than quarterly unless we were to set a special subscription charge to our members, a practice which we are anxious to avoid.

On the other hand, your Directors feel that the welfare of the Society demands that we contact our members with an official publication oftener than quarterly. It is desirable that we keep our membership informed of the latest philatelic developments, not only within the Society, but in philatelic matters generally. "THE CANADIAN PHILATELIST" requires considerable time for editing and printing and it is difficult to add late news without upsetting the whole make-up of the magazine.

To solve this problem, it has been suggested that "THE CANADIAN PHILATELIST" be devoted largely to the publication of outstanding articles of philatelic interest, and that to keep our members posted the Society should publish a Supplementary Monthly Letter eleven times yearly (July-August being a combined issue) with the express purpose of keeping the membership informed on the latest happenings both within the Society and in the philatelic world generally.

This NEWS LETTER will bring you each month up-to-the-minute information from all the Society's Departments - the Executive-Secretary's Office - the Sales Department - the Library - will bring you up-to-date lists of new members and changes in address - announcements of interest to the members of the Society and its associated Stamp Clubs - post office department releases - and all last minute news of philatelic interest.

The Executive Secretary would be pleased to have your comments on this first issue as well as constructive criticism and suggestions which would make this NEWS LETTER of greater value to you throughout the year.

SPECIAL NOTICE RE "POPULAR STAMPS"

At our recent Annual Meeting it was decided that effective with the July-August Issue, the Society should be relieved of its commitment to supply "POPULAR STAMPS" Magazine to its members as a part of the annual membership fees. This decision is due to the inauguration of our own official magazine - "The Canadian Philatelist".

However, realizing that some members may wish to have their subscription to "POPULAR STAMPS" continued, the Society has arranged that this can be done through the Society if the Executive Secretary receives WRITTEN NOTICE of your desire, accompanied by a remittance of \$1.00 for one year's subscription commencing September 1, 1950. For your convenience, a special subscription form is enclosed with this NEWS LETTER, which you should fill in and return to the Executive Secretary, Mr. P. J. McCabe, 40 Stanley Ave., Mimico, Ontario, along with your remittance.

The Society continues to recommend "POPULAR STAMPS" to you as an excellent publication of philatelic interest, but now that we have our own publication, it is, of course, quite impossible to continue to supply it as a part of your membership.

CHANGE IN SALES DEPARTMENT

We regret to report the resignation of Mr. Ken. Haigh as Sales Manager of the Canadian Philatelic Society. Poor health has caused him to give up a job for the Society in which he did excellent work.

The Directors have appointed Mr. Cyril Woodhead to take over these duties, and he is now engaged in reorganizing the sales books and records. While the department will not re-commence operations until next month, Mr. Woodhead will be pleased to receive books of stamps to place in his circuits during the coming season. Blank Sales Books may be obtained now by writing to the new Sales Manager at 529 Winona Drive, Toronto.

Our new Sales Manager needs no introduction to any but our newest members. Cyril was our President for a number of years during which time a rapid advance in membership and services was made. We know he is going to make just as great a success as Sales Manager for the Society. Our members can anticipate that the sale of stamps entrusted to this department will be energetically and efficiently handled.

OUR NEW BRITISH AFFILIATION

The Canadian Philatelic Society has become affiliated with the British Philatelic Association Limited, and plans are under way to extend the privileges of this Society to our own affiliated clubs who so desire it.

Mr. Fred Green, Co-Ordinator of Affiliated Clubs, will shortly be communicating with the Secretaries of all our affiliated collector's groups, and will send each of them a copy of "Philately", the splendid bi-monthly publication of the British Association. To all clubs who wish to receive this service the nominal charge of \$1.50 per year will be made. "Philately" will make a splendid addition to your local club library.

We are also arranging to place the names of the secretaries of all affiliated clubs on our own mailing list to receive copies of "Canadian Philately" and our "Monthly News Letters". You are requested to keep the Society informed of all changes of officers in the local clubs.

Individual members of our Society will benefit by our tie-up with the British Philatelic Association, and may also be placed on the subscription list for the interesting magazine "Philately" by sending \$2.00 annually to our Executive Secretary.

ARE YOU IN GOOD STANDING?

In a recent mailing we notified members that their annual fees became due on April 1st of each year. We are pleased to note that there was a ready response, and many members remitted promptly. But, as usual in such matters, some forgot to do so. If you have failed to remit your annual fees to the Executive Secretary, may we suggest that you do so right away, before it is again overlooked.

It is the policy of the Society that our mailing list should contain only the names of paid-up members - which means that only members in good standing will be receiving copies of "The Canadian Philatelist", the monthly "News Letter" of the Society, and the many other advantages that go with membership in the C.P.S.

ITEMS OF INTEREST

It is rumored that the Post Office Department will make available to the public in July a new Air Mail Letter Sheet with an embossed 10¢ stamp illustrating the Canadian countryside. No official announcement has been made of this issue as yet.

P.O. PHILATELIC BRANCH ANNOUNCEMENT

We are pleased to reprint the following announcement from the Post Office Dept. which was issued under date of June 1st, 1950.

KING GEORGE VI, 1949 ISSUE, REVISED DESIGN, BOOKS AND ROLLS

"The stamps of King George VI, 1949 issue, revised design (which includes the words "Postes" and "Postage") are now available assembled in books and rolls. The books sell for 25¢ each regardless of denomination. The 3¢ books contain 8 x 3¢ stamps, the 4¢ books contain 6 x 4¢ stamps and the Combination Books contain 3 x 4¢, 3 x 3¢ and 3 x 1¢ stamps. Postage stamp books are printed in English and bilingually - English and French.

The same design of stamps is available in rolls of the 1¢, 2¢, 3¢, 4¢ and 1¢ precancelled denominations. There are 500 stamps to a roll. It is regretted that these stamps cannot be selected for centering and the patron must accept all sales as final.

The same design, overprinted O.H.M.S. is now available in the 1¢, 2¢, 3¢ and 4¢ denominations. The 5¢ denomination has been available since October, 1949.

In view of the shortage of stamps overprinted O.H.M.S. it was necessary to perforate O.H.M.S. the 2¢ and 3¢ King George VI, 1949 issue, revised design, in order to supply Government offices. A quantity of these stamps is available in the Philatelic Section.

This issue of postage stamps has been delivered by the manufacturers in the following plate numbers:

1¢ - Plates Nos. 1 and 2	2¢ - Plates Nos. 1 and 2
3¢ - Plates Nos. 1, 2 and 3	4¢ - Plates Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.
5¢ - Plates Nos. 1 and 2	

Most positions of all plate numbers listed above may be purchased from the Philatelic Section.

Patrons are reminded that plate numbers, plate number positions or any specific stamp on a pane will be supplied only when specifically ordered. Please indicate substitution preference if plate number or position is not in stock. In order to secure plate numbers, plate number positions or a specific stamp on a pane, the following minimum quantities of stamps must be ordered for each item desired:

100 stamps	(full sheet) each of the 1-cent to 5-cent denominations, inclusive, regular issue.
50 stamps	(full sheet) of the 4-cent commemorative.
25 stamps	(half sheet) of each of the 7-cent to 20-cent denominations, inclusive, regular issue.
10 stamps	of each of the 50-cent and \$1.00 denominations, regular issue.

1946 ISSUE, \$1.00 POSTAGE STAMP OVERPRINTED "O.H.M.S."

The stock of this stamp was exhausted in March. A further quantity has now been obtained from the manufacturers and philatelic orders are being accepted.

YOUR CO-OPERATION IS WANTED

A live-wire Society has to be constantly on the look-out for new members - that is why we keep asking your co-operation in advising other stamp collectors of the advantages of being a member of Canada's National Society.

We are most anxious to extend the privileges of membership to all stamp collectors, but our financial resources do not permit us to do this on a "gratis" basis. It is only as we secure new members that we get the necessary added revenue to enable us to carry out our plans to give a service that will be a benefit to all stamp collectors.

We are proud of the fact that in the last few years the membership of the Canadian Philatelic Society has greatly increased, but we know that there are still thousands of collectors who would gladly become associated with our national organization if they were told about it and encouraged to join it by one of its present members.

The Executive of the Society has no way of getting in contact with these collectors except through the co-operation of its present members. You unquestionably know a great many men and women who are interested in this hobby, just as you are. Why not tell them that in addition to local clubs there is a great national organization - The Canadian Philatelic Society - which exists for the purpose of disseminating philatelic information to all collectors through its publications "The Canadian Philatelist" and the monthly "News Letter" and which offers many services to collectors which they cannot obtain from another source.

We are enclosing an Application Blank with this News Letter, and urge you to use it to persuade at least one other stamp collector to become a member of the Society during the coming month.

NOTED WOMAN AUCTIONEER VISITS CANADA

A few days ago, an outstanding woman stamp auctioneer visited Toronto, and because of what some would say was an unusual profession, her visit attracted attention from the Toronto press, and an interview with her was published in the Toronto "Globe & Mail".

The visitor was Miss Ethel Harper, a Director of the internationally-known firm of Robson Lowe, of London and Bournemouth, England, and Philadelphia, U.S.A.

Miss Harper told the reporter that stamp auctions are among the most exciting in the world. So well organized and split-second-timed are they that it is possible to print programs weeks in advance with the exact moment when each lot will come up for auction. She figures 3½ minutes per item for her own auctioneering.

Her customers, she says, come from all classes. At a recent collector's dinner she attended were 567 people, including one king (Carol of Roumania), several dukes, counts, knights, businessmen, shopkeepers, and a number of factory workers, laborers, even men whose daytime occupations were as garbage-collectors. She cites military and naval men as enthusiastic for the hobby, probably because of their wide-flung opportunities as they follow their profession around the globe. Doctors, lawyers, accountants and big business executives are enthusiastic over the hobby as a relief from the many problems of their profession, she says.

Age makes no difference to the hobby, too, she notes. One of the finest collections of Canadian stamps at a recent exhibition was the possession of a 12-year old London boy who specialized in Canada after hearing about it from two older brothers who had been here as war guests. On the other hand it is a favorite occupation of elderly persons who have retired from business life, and her company often follows its customers through from boyhood to the grave, afterwards buying back the collection which has outlived its owner.

Miss Harper was in Canada partly in connection with next year's Philatelic Exhibition in Toronto next year, which marks the centenary of the first issue of Canadian postage stamps. She predicts that if the exhibition reaches anything like the heights of excitement and interest of London exhibitions it will be a great event.
