ON SALE IN CANADA

As a service to Canadian collectors, the Australian Government Trade Commissioner announces that mint copies of current Australian stamps in singles, blocks or sheets are now available at his office, 100 Sparks St., Ottawa.

Prices are calculated at the rate of \$2.36 to the Australian pound, subject to alterations in the exchange rate. All cheques, money orders or postal notes are to be in Canadian funds payable to the Australian Government Trade Commissioner.

Available current stamps are the regular issue of Australia from the ½d. to the £2 stamp; the Commonwealth Jubilee Issue; and the Gold Commemorative Issue; A list giving detailed price for each stamp is available from his office. Space does not permit publishing it here. However, the current set to 1/- is prices at 62¢; to 2/- at \$1.18 and the complete set to £2 is \$10.03 per set.

A further announcement from this office is that the current 3d. stamp has been changed to green in color effective on November 14th, and that stocks of it and the new 7½d. stamp are also available.

The latest news release announces the new 3d. stamp illustrated at the head of this article. It is brown red in color and replaces the 3rd. blue value first introduced in 1942. It is issued in sheets of 160, perforated 15x14. Stocks are expected in Ottawa before the end of November.
