NEW ISSUES AND OLD ONES

Victory Stamps will not be issued by Newfoundland. Canada's contribution to the Peace Issue is represented by the 10¢ Special Delivery, embodying the laurel and the olive branches therein. To date Victory Issues received locally include Cayman Is., Gambia, Fiji, and two bicolor from Hong Kong which depart from the general design. Another Peace Issue has appeared from Bahawalpur and is commanding a good price. South of the border the New Mexico issue announced for Sept. is finally to be released from Sante Fe on Oct. 16th. Ireland has honoured two of its patriots, Parnell and Davitt, on a 2½d. and a 3d.

Illustrated in "Philately" for Sept. 30th is a preliminary sketch of the 1947 stamp to be issued to commemorate the first U.S. postage stamps. A souvenir sheet with replicas of the 1847 stamps will also be issued.

A Flying Mail Car has been inaugurated on the New York to San Francisco flight. Something else new is a trial of a Helicopter service in Chicago. A photo of this plane appeared Oct. 1st in the Toronto Evening Telegram.

One for the Books: Stamp Collecting, London, Eng., reports the Canadian \$1.00 stamp as showing a Train Ferry operating between Vancouver and P.E.I. ????

Our FIRST DAY Covers cancelled at Sudbury, Ont., bearing the new Air Mail stamp showing the Canada Goose flying near that city make a beautiful item for your collection. There are some of these available yet. If you did not get yours, mail the Treasurer, 20¢ in stamps, before it is too late.
