that Falkland Islands, with this Fort, the Storehouses, Wharfs, Harbours, Bays and Creeks thereunto belonging, are the Sole Right and Property of His Most Sacred Majesty, George the Third, King of Great Britain, France and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, etc. In witness whereof this plate is set up, and His Britannic Majesty's colours left flying as a mark of possession by -

S. W. Clayton,
Commanding Officer at Falkland Islands.
A. D. 1774.

The above is a copy of the inscription, engraved in lead, which was fixed on the door of the block-house at the British Settlement, Saunders Island, on May 20th, 1774.

"THE POSTAGE STAMPS OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS AND DEPENDENCIES"

- By B. S. H. Grant, F.R.P.S.L. 140 Pages

This is a must for the collectors of the Falklands, and good reading for any collector. It is just off the press. The preface was written in May, 1952. The Author is a well known collector and student of the Postal History and Stamps of the Falkland Islands and Dependencies.

He has also received the willing collaboration of many other students of the Falkland Islands stamps, one of whom contributed an entire chapter (IV) on the early Victorian Issues. Mr. Grant has had the fullest possible assistance from the Colonial Office, the Crown Agents for the Colonies, and also the Falkland Islands authorities. Messrs. Bradbury, Wilkinson & Co., Ltd., placed their records and sample sheets at his disposal and Messrs. Thomas De La Rue & Co. have also given every assistance in connection with the stamps printed by them.

The collector is always interested in the arms of his pet country, but very seldom can find any reference to them in the numerous works that have been consulted. But here can be found the description of not only the new coat of arms, but the old as well, written in heraldic language. Just the thing for a write-up, which goes for the whole book.

The story of the Falkland Islands is unfolded as the book proceeds making it very good reading for every collector and a great increase in knowledge of the science of philately. In the book there is much of interest about this far-flung outpost of the British Empire.

Speaking of the Falkland Islands - here we have four stamps, and from there we travel to a goodly part of the Commonwealth, seeing many strange animals portrayed on interesting stamps from equally interesting places. - Rossite Stamp Strip.
