#### **EMPIRE ON YONGE STREET**

Dear Friends:-

There is one merchant on Yonge Street that advertises extensively by Radio, T.V. and Newspaper saying "That you've got to be good to make it on Yonge Street."

Well Empire has been located at 1150 Yonge Street since May 1940, so that gives us 37 years of that "Got to be Good" philosophy.

Did you know that Yonge Street is the longest street in the world. To be exact, 1,178.3 miles, beginning at Lake Ontario to the south and stretching to Rainy River on the north. It is listed in the Guinness' Book of Records as such. In essence it opened up the entire northwest and allowed communities north of York to be explored, developed and serviced.

Yonge Street has many "firsts." For example in 1861, the first street car line in Canada was inaugurated.

In 1833 the first section of macadamized road in British North America was constructed.

In 1879 the first electric power generator lit McConkey's Restaurant on Yonge Street.

Who was the first stamp dealer on Yonge Street? I sure would like to know - if you have any knowledge of the very early dealers, please get in touch with me so I can make some kind of record of the "History of Stamp Dealers on Yonge Street."

Now, let me tell you about several interesting purchases made during the last month. One was a large and extensive collection of Canada, Australia and British Colonies from a retired Toronto business man. He read last month's letter about my remarks on insurance costs just about the time his policy was up for renewal, and he decided to sell. It was an easy lot to value, as he had a good inventory. Within 30 minutes of entering his house, the deal was completed and I was on my way back to the office with the stamps.

Another collector sold me his collection of mint Canadian - all in complete sheets with the rarer high values in blocks of four or larger. There was also a nice lot of P.E.I. and Nova Scotia to add to our stock.

#### \$175,000 "CONSORT" STAMP COLLECTION TO BE AUCTIONED BY GIBBONS

Stanley Gibbons are to auction the £175,000 "Consort" collection of early Canadian stamps and postal history in London on November 24.

This important two-volume collection, the property of a renowned millionaire collector, will be offered as 300 unreserved lots. It is one of the finest collections ever formed of the Colony of Canada and covers the interesting period 1840 - 1864.

#### Unique First Stamp

The most exciting rarity to be offered is the first recorded stamp of the Colony, the unique Postmaster's Provisional 3d black of 1851 printed on an envelope which was sent in April 1851 from New Carlisle to Toronto (Fig. 1). This fabulous item has not appeared in auction since 2 April, 1963 when it realised £220. It is expected to reach a price in excess of the 1978 Gibbons catalogue price of £16.000.

The collection throughout is notable for the fine condition of the material it contains. A section of pre-adhesive stamp

covers included Money Letters, Too Late mail and Grand Trunk Railway letters.

Superb examples of the famous 1851 12d black include an unused pair in the finest possible condition. (Fig. 2). This alone could fetch as much as £50,000.

All other issues, perforated and imperforate, to 1864 are well represented with scarce and fine examples, used and unused, and on cover. Of particular note is an unused 1852 - 57 6d purple, one of the rarest stamps of Canada in unused condition.

The "Consort" collection - so called because of the large number of stamps Silver Juniles

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contained depicting Prince Albert - is the finest of its kind to come on the market for many years.

#### NEW EDITORS COME ON THE SCENE

There seems to be a general exodus of club editors this summer. Kim Frandsen has turned over the editorship of the "Edmonton Stamp Club Bulletin" to Wolfgang Belau. Wolfgang has a "hard act to follow" as did Kim before him. The E.S.C. Bulletin has long had a reputation for excellence which has been maintained since the editorship of the late Wyn Goodale in 1969.

In Winnipeg "The Buffalo" of the Winnipeg Philatelic Society will also have a new editor. Doug Poapst will be taking over from George Warnoch who has been editing their fine publication since July 1975.

Here in the east the "Postal History Society of Ontario Journal" (formerly "The Postal Histo-Mine") is under a new editor, Peter Wiedmann who assumed the editorship several issues ago upon the resignation of Graham Noble. The Journal is also due for another change, but only in title as the Society has, as of June 25th, changed its name and scope (see notice elsewhere in this issue).

Another publication, one which is probably not as well known as it should be to English speaking philatelists, is "La Philatélie au Québec". It is the monthly journal of the Fedération des Societies Philatéliques du Québec. This federation recently changed its name to La Fédération québécoise de philatélie and has appointed M. Jean Lafortune as editor to replace M. Cimon Morin who is now librarian of the National Postal Museum.

To all of the above clubs, we extend our thanks for keeping us on your mailing list. We appreciate receiving your journals and having the opportunity of read your activities and the notes and article which accompany your more general announcements.

Re: American Air Mail Catalogue 5th Edition: Volume III Canada.

"I have been appointed Chairman of the Committee for the revision and update of the Canadian Section, Volume III of the American Air Mail Catalogue, 5th Edition. The last revision was prepared in 1970. The next revision publication is planned for 1979.

I wish to obtain as wide an input as possible for this revision to make it useful to dealers, auctioneers and collectors.

"If you are willing to comment on the Canadian (and Newfoundland) Sections of Volume III 5th Edition please let me know and I'll send you a Xerox copy of the relevant sections to be revised. If you concur, I would appreciate a reply with recommendations within two months. Thank you for your assistance in this matter."

News of a new find in the Admiral precancels.

Dear Sir:

"I would like to report the finding of a new re-entry of the 10 cent blue Admiral. The stamp has been seen by Mr. Hans Rieche, who has identified it as a re-entry and a new find, different from the two mentioned in the part 2 of his handbook. It is at his suggestion that I attempt these few lines.

"The re-entry shows in many parts of the bottom third of the stamp. Doubling can be seen in the horizontal lines of shading on the coat, both on the shoulder and the area below the medals, in the largest cross of the decorations, in the oval below the portrait, in the bottom maple leaf on both sides, in the numeral 1 in both boxes, in the upper box line on the left side and in all the letters of TEN CENTS.

"The stamp is from the dry printing and is precancelled Niagara Falls, Ont."

Early responses to our request for information about difficulties our members may be having in receiving their orders from the Philatelic Service are presented below. These letters, plus those received after our deadline, indicate that the Service is still not back to normal.

Mr. Asbury does not state whether his orders were separate mail orders or were filled against a deposit account. The time interval mentioned would indicate that they were the former.

Dear Sir:

"... My own experience would suggest that the delays which Mr. Bean and Mr. Ross have experienced are typical. For example, I received my order for the May 3 issue — 12c. "Houses of Parliament", on July 11th - a lapse of practically 10 weeks, instead of the 3 weeks "allowed for delivery".

"This (2 to 3 months) is standard."

Dear Sir,

"In reference to the many letters appearing in Canadian Philatelist on the subject of the efficiency (or lack thereof) of Canada Post's Philatelic Service, I should like to relate my own exerience in dealing with the Mail Order Service in Ottawa.

"I don't know if I am the rule or the exception, but I have never had any major problems with my orders from Canada Post. I have had a standing order subscription account with Ottawa for over two years, and in that time I have never received an insufficient order, an excess, or a substitution and have received exactly one stamp in any sort of damaged condition. In addition, all indivdual orders

in excess of my subscription requirements which I have placed have, to date, been flawlessly filled. Once, a payment of \$3.05 was mislaid, but my account was properly credited after a brief correspondence; I do not consider this a major fault with the Philatelic Service.

"Granted, deliveries take a long time — I usually do not receive my subscription until three or four weeks after the date of issue, and individual orders take even longer to fill — but it takes a similar length of time to receive responses from most of the governmental philatelic agencies throughout the world with which I have dealt, including the USPS and UNPA.

"Perhaps I am fortunate in never having had any major problems with Canada Post, or perhaps it is simply a case of those who have had problems being the only ones to speak up on the matter; at any rate, there is at least one satisfied customer on Ottawa's philatelic subscription rolls."

# MEET THE PROFESSIONALS COME TO HARMERS

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# THE DE PINEDO INHERITANCE: FORTUNE OR FRAUD?

- A REPLY -

Mr. J. P. Starr rightly states in his article in the Canadian Philatelist of May-June, 1977 that transatlantic aviation created much excitement 50 years ago. Perhaps less so than eight years earlier when the U.S. NC-4's, flying in hops from Newfoundland, were the first heavier-than-air machines to cross the Atlantic, when Alcock and Brown made the first non-stop airplane flight and the British airship, R-34 made the double crossing.

Having studied the history of the air stamps of, and the flights and mail from Newfoundland for fifty years, I do not recall any controversy over the unused Pinedo or the covers. There was much more argument over the Hawker stamp of 1919 because of the limited issue. Philately had not then become attuned to the necessarily restricted number of letters carried on the planes of that era - an obvious weight factor where every pound was of importance.

In the book Newfoundland Air Mails by R. E. R. Dalwick and me, published in 1953, ten pages are devoted to the Pinedo saga and full details of the overprinting given. The Printers Job Record Card (confirming that 300 stamps were issued in six half sheets of fifty) was illustrated as was the proof sheet of the setting. From this it is possible to plate every stamp and the comparison of a block makes the task less tedious.

In the 24 years since our book was published fresh information has naturally come to light. I know now that A. B. Perlin purchased eight copies of the stamp, not four as we stated on page 84 of our book but of the 46 sold or presented (20 to Pinedo) no one knows how many were retained unused. As to the reputed 254 sold over the counter at the St. John's Post

Office, this figure does not tie up with the Post Office Notice that by 9 oclock on May 19 (the day following the issue of the stamp) the limited number of stamps (225) had all been sold. It seems probable that this was more likely to be the number of Letters with overprinted stamps. But not too much reliance should be placed on figures which often seemed designed to "balance the books". The stamps were supposed to be affixed to the envelopes at the Post Office but were they all? Some were certainly retained by the purchasers and at least a few were used on covers after the flight.

Since the stamp was issued my "guesstimate" of the probable number of unused was not less than 40 with a probable maximum of around 50 so Mr. Starr's figure is certainly around the mark.

Forgeries: Any rare stamp is liable to be forged and the Pinedo, one of the most expensive twentieth century rarities, especially unused, is no exception. In the autumn of 1933 Percy Fearn of St. John's attempted to sell through our London firm, H. R. Harmer of Bond Street, a mint pair of Pinedos but on arrival we found that they were obvious forgeries and returned them.

This resulted in my going to St. John's to give evidence at his trial in January, 1934. He was found guilty of having sold 18 forged unused Pinedos, 180 forged unused Balbos and the attempt to sell our firm the Pinedo pair mentioned above. He was sentenced to two years hard labour.

Forgeries: There does not seem to be any evidence that de Thuin was involved and I have never heard of Pindikowski of Hearts Content, a Newfoundland outport of modest size in 1927. It is difficult to believe that at the age of 89, isolated from even modest technical expertise, he could have

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produced anything capable of fooling even a modestly erudite philatelist. And as I have stated it is possible to plate the 50 stamps comprising the setting. But the "Discovery several years ago of several large blocks of mint overprinted de Pinedo stamps" is of outstanding importance, if they are genuine, and raises many questions. "Large" and "several" must surely indicate a quantity of not less than 24 and probably more.

Mr. Starr has gone into much detail but he does not say who was the "distant relative", the "present owner" or any information about his "youngest daughter", or who are the "several knowledgable collectors". Nor does he tell us if these "several blocks" have been examined by competent specialists in Newfoundland airstamps or by any of the Expert Committees.

If the records are correct Pinedo had 20 (and he is known to have given some away), A. B. Perlin had eight, four of which he used on covers, W. J. Woodford, Minister of Posts, had seven and J. G. Hodder, Deputy Minister of Posts, had five. So not very many blocks can exist and as far as is known there are only two blocks of four known today.

If Mr. Starr will let me have a clear colour photograph of one or all of the blocks, I do not think there will be any difficulty in telling him if there is any chance of them being authentic.

It is a beautiful story and for the present owner's sake I hope it is true but it seems unlikely to have a happy fairy-tale ending. However, one never knows, so let us try and solve this intriguing problem.

## CANADIAN PAINTERS IN PHILATELY

Part 2 Conclusion

Franklin Carmichael was born in Orillia, Ontario, and studied at the Ontario College of Art where he was an instructor from 1932 until his death in 1945. He was an able decorative landscape painter with a neat style which lent itself to water-colours.


Like Varley, Arthur Lismer was born in Sheffield, England. He came to Canada in 1911 and opened a studio in Toronto. His early paintings showed the influence of the French Impressionists. In 1916, Lismer embarked on a life-long career of teaching art - as Principal of the Nova Scotia College of Art until 1919, then Vice-Principal of the Ontario College of Art until 1927. In 1936 he spent a year in South Africa and also lectured in Australia and New Zealand. It is interesting to note that Lismer, Varley and Carmichael all studied at the Antwerp Academy in Belgium.

A. Y. Jackson remained the most faithful exponent of the original tenets of the Group of Seven. He travelled across Canada for almost half a century and it is doubtful if any other man has seen more of this country and observed it to such creative purpose.


James Wilson Morrice (1865-1924) was born in Montreal and obtained his B.A. at the University of Toronto in 1886. In 1890 he went to Paris and studied painting at the Julian Academy and under Henri Harpignies. He spent most of his life in France and his work was influenced strongly by Whistler and Matisse. He travelled extensively, painting in Italy, North Africa, the West Indies and Ouebec. He was therefore better known abroad than in Canada, although his most widely reproduced work has been 'The Ferry, Quebec' (Sc. 464). He created for Canadian War Memorials 1918, a collection of paintings and sculptures relating to the First World War. These works were commissioned by the War Records Committee headed by Lord Beaverbrook. A large number of Canadian and English artists contributed, including Lismer, Varley and Jackson of the Group of Seven. Morrice died in Tunis, North Africa and exhibitions of his work were organized in Montreal in 1925 and in Ottawa in 1937. He is now regarded as one of Canada's greatest painters.

In 1969 the century of the birth of Marc Aurèle de Foy Suzor-Côté (1869-1937) was commemorated by the 50c. stamp (Sc. 492) depicting his painting 'Return from the Harvest Fields'. It was the first attempt in Canada to reproduce a work of art in full colour (by photogravure) on a stamp. It was considered to be quite ugly with indistinct detail and murky colour. The reduction in size to 1½ square inches from the 9 square

feet of the painting in the National Gallery of Canada in Ottawa, and perhaps the printing process itself, just does not capture the depth and warmth of the original. When he returned to Canada after his travels in Europe (1889-1908), Suzor-Côté painted other landscapes and illustrated the original edition of Hemon's Maria Chapdelaine in 1916 (see Scott 659 of 1975) and Sir Andrew MacPhail's translation in 1921.

In 1971 the centenary of the birth of Emily Carr (1871-1945) was commemorated by the 6c. stamp (Sc. 532) depicting her painting The Big Raven. This was faithfully reproduced by four-colour lithographic printing. Like Suzor-Cote, she went to Europe and returned from Paris in 1912. She had learned about Impressionism but her work was ridiculed, partly because at that time there was no sympathy by critics or public with modern painting. However in 1927 she was persuaded to lend 50 canvases for an exhibition in Ottawa and they aroused the interest of a new generation of critics and artists, including Lawren Harris of the Group of Seven. She began painting again in British Columbia, the province where she was born and which she loved so passionately.

Also in 1971, the centenary of the death of Paul Kane (1810-1871) was commemorated by a 7c. stamp (Sc. 553). He was an artist-recorder like his contemporary Kreighoff but his Indian subjects and panoramic scenes of the West are considered to be stolid, withdrawn, and often inhospitable. Born in Ireland, he came to

Canada as a boy and first gained a knowledge of art at the Grammar School in York (Toronto). After studying in the United States and Europe, he returned to Canada and arranged to travel with the Hudson's Bay Company's brigades from 1846-1848. On his trips through the Northwest, Kane produced many sketches which he later elaborated into oil paintings. He possessed a keen reporter' eye but his creative equipment was limited and his colours were confined to browns, greens and greys. His contrived neo-classical compositions reflect his European travels. His Indian chiefs adopted the poses out of David and his horses resemble Arab stallions more than rearing Western ponies. The Indians of the Plains stamp issued in 1972 (Sc. 562) seem to be a development of Kane's style. (It is from a painting by George Catlin. Ed.).

In 1972 the centenary of the death of Cornelius Krieghoff was marked by the 8c. stamp (Sc. 610). There is some doubt as to when and where he was born: the stamp itself clearly states that he was born in 1815 but the Encyclopedia Canadiana says 'b.1812 or later in Dusseldorf or Amsterdam'. Certainly his mother was Dutch and Cornelius studied music and art in Rotterdam as well as Dusseldorf and Bavaria. After travelling in Europe, he joined the United States Army in 1837 and fought in the Seminole Indian War until 1840, then became an official war artist in the U.S. War Department. He arrived in Toronto in 1846 to join his brother and opened a studio. In 1848 he moved to Montreal where he painted landscapes and portraits,

then in 1853 to Quebec City where he remained for 13 years. There he did his finest work, revealing the close observation, minute rendering of detail and the high colouring of the German school of painting. His anecdotal portrayals of habitant life, winter sketches and Indians are prized as records of an earlier way of life. Krieghoff was not a vital creative artist but he had a wry and disarming sense of humour and affection for warmth and liveliness, as well as the brilliant colours. He spent his last years in Chicago where he died in 1872.

Since 1973, our postal authorities seem to have been more concerned with trying to help the Olympic Games break even than with recognizing our traditional painters. However, we should credit the artists named on the four Christmas stamps of 1974 (Sc. 650-653) and the unnamed

children whose work was featured on the 1975 Christmas stamps (Sc. 674-679).

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
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#### LES POSTES SOUS LE REGIME FRANCAIS

#### By GUY DES RIVIERES

Sous le régime français au XVIIIème siècle, la colonie étant constituée de groupe d'habitations le long du fleuve St-Laurent, les communications étaient très difficiles entre les différents groupements, surtout durant la saison d'hiver.

Jusqu'au dèbut du XVIIIième siècle, aucun semblant de service n'existait, les quelques routes ou pistes et surtout les rivières en été constituaient les seuls moyens de communications et les quelques lettres privées devaient être confiées à un messager, un employé ou à la courtoisie d'un ami voyageur.

De Québec durant l'été, les navires transportaient les lettres de France au Canada et vice-versa. Aucune charge n'était imposée pour le transport transatlantique mais rendues en France, le destinaire devait payer les charges postales du port d'arrivée en France à la destination.

En 1705, l'intendant Jacques Raudot nomma Pedro Dasylva un portuguais, citoyen de Québec, messager pour la colonie de la Nouvelle France. Sa fonction consistait à transporter les dépêches officielles et les lettres privées. (Les Québecois qui ont suivi le téléroman Les Forges de St-Maurice se rappelleront les références au portuguais lorsqu'il s'agissait d'expédier des lettres à Québec). La charge pour ce service était de dix sols (un sol équivalait à environ un cent), pour une lettre de Québec à Montréal, et cinq sols de Trois-Rivières à l'une ou l'autre de ces villes et proportionnellement pour tout autre village le long de la route.

Dasylva exerça ce service jusqu'à son décès en 1717 et son gendre Jean Moran lui succéda.

En 1721 à la requête de l'intendant Begon, le gouverneur Vaudreuil signa une ordonnance concédant à Jean François Eustache Lenouillier de Boisclerc, arpenteur, le privilège exclusif pendant vingt (20) ans pour transporter le courrier, d'organiser et maintenir des postes de relais et un service de diligence entre Québec et Montréal. Cette ordonnance créa en fait un monopole des communications en faveur de Boisclerc. Cependant ce derneir n'ayant pas rempli les conditions qui lui étaient imposées par l'ordonnance, ce plan ne fut jamais mis en exécution.

Durant ce temps, Moran continuait le service de courrier postal commercé par son beau-père Dasylva mais ce n'est qu'en 1727 qu'il reçut une reconnaissance officielle et reçut sa commission de l'intendant Dupuy et le continua probablement jusqu'à son décès en 1754, il se peut que quelques membres de la famille aient continué le service avant le décès de Moran, ceci ne peut être confirmé, car aucun document officiel de cette époque ne le démontre. Le service fut semble-t-il continué par la famille Moran jusqu'au moment de la cession de la Nouvelle-France à l'Angleterre.

Les documents cependent démontrent qu'une route sous la direction de Boisclerc, l'arpenteur ci-haut mentionné, fut ouverte en 1734 (chemin du Roy) entre Québec et Montréal avec l'établissement de postes de relais à tous les trois lieues (9 milles) et six traversiers sur les principales rivières. Ceci a eu pour effet de hâter considérablement les communications entre Québec et Montréal, mais durant la saison estivale le transport des communications entre Québec et Montréal se faisait plus rapidement

# "CORRECTED" AIRMAIL SPECIAL DELIVERY STAMP - FIRST DAY OF USE -

On 16th September, 1946, there was issued a set of nine Canadian stamps usually referred to as the "Peace" Issue. It included a seven cent airmail stamp and a seventeen cent airmail special delivery stamp in a new design showing a view of Quebec City looking northeast and including the Plains of Abraham. Superimposed on this view was the picture of a DC-4M airplane, then under construction in Montreal, for use on the trans-Atlantic passenger and mail route.

The initial "mock-up" of this latter stamp was sent to the Post Office Department, by the printers, on 4th December, 1945, and doubtless passed through the usual stages of tentative and final approval. It was produced during the following year and issued, with the set, on the above-mentioned date.

Criticism of some of the stamps of the new issue was soon heard, notably by members of the federal Parliament. This was directed initially to the eight cent value in which the plough illustrated was shown turning a left hand furrow and to the fifty cent value which showed a woodsman in the unlikely posture of having his back towards a falling tree. These matters were duly reported in Popular Stamps (Sept. 1946) in which the writer ended his account by exhorting "variety hunters among philatelists to make their contributions."

These were not slow in coming. The only variety which became the subject of comment being, however, the use of the circumflex instead of the grave accent over the last E of "EPRESS". The excitement soon subsided and there was surprisingly little discussion of the error in the BNA

in the printing.

And so we come to October 1946 when, early in the month, a news item concerning the incorrect accent appeared in the "Ottawa Journal" newspaper. It described an interview with Mr. A. Stanley Deaville, head of the Philatelic Division, Post Office Department, by a "Journal" reporter, the matter of the accent being discussed at length. In a subsequent brush with the reporter following this interview, Mr. Deaville was quoted by the same newspaper as saying that the Post Office Dept., knew about the matter "but did not in any way refer to it as an "error" (sic), although I am made to do so in the article."

Well, "the jig was up" and something had to be done and was done. A new die for the 17c. was prepared with the correct grave accent substituted for the circumflex. The new stamp was issued on 3rd December 1946 at the Besserer Street Post Office, Ottawa, only. There was no prior announcement and certainly no fanfare over the correction - rather the opposite, the postal authorities, understandably, were only too glad to get the incident over

and forgotten!

On the day of issue a local collector, Preston Hackett, was told about the correction by a Post Office employee who showed him a sheet of the new stamp which had just been received. This was just before noon and Preston spent the lunch hour, quite commendably, notifying a few of his friends and preparing a few first day covers. Fig. 1 shows an example of these covers.

Actually, very few covers were put through as none of us thought that the change would merit catalogue listing.

The epitaph on this matter seems to have been a release put out by the Canadian Press and published in the Toronto (and presumably, in other) papers, probably later in December 1946. The newspaper clipping shown in Fig. 2 was found in the stamp papers of a friend who had passed on. Since he lived in Toronto it is likely it

was cut from a Toronto paper, but I cannot be sure as it carried no notation.

It is interesting to note that the knowledge of the first day of issue of this stamp has never become general and I do not recall having seen the known first day date of Dec. 3, 1946 quoted in any lists or catalogues.

#### ERROR WAS 'GRAVE' SO STAMP RARITY

Ottawa, Dec. 13 — (CP) — Quietly and unannounced, the post-office department has issued a new postage stamp to rectify an inadvertent error in the current 17-cent airmailspecial delivery stamp which went

on sale Sept. 16.

Latest version of the 17-centre is a re-engraving known technically as "Die Two." which corrects a circumflex accent which was erroneously placed over the second "e" in the French word "expres" on the first stamp. The new stamp correctly bears the grave accent. Erroneous stamps are destined to become a rarity for postage stamp collectors because it was on sale only for 12 weeks.

But I do know this to have been the correct date of issue and the accuracy of this knowledge is confirmed by a letter recently received from Mr. J. E. Kraemer, Manager of the National Postal Museum, which reads as follows:-

28 April 1977

Dear Mr. Bayley:
With reference to your enquiry concerning the first day of issue of the Revised 17c. Special Delivery stamp, Scotts #CE4 issued in 1946. I am pleased to advise as follows. The revised, Type 2, 17c. stamp went on sale on Dec. 3, 1946. Very few covers were cancelled on the first day of issue according to information at hand.

I trust this information will be of interest.

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#### UNIQUE FROM THE YUKON

Pictured above is the only reported publicity cover for the Yukon Exposition of 1912, bearing both a corner card and slogan cancellation publicizing the exposition. As a specialist in exposition postal history, the writer has known of the existence of this cover for some 15 years (since it was written up by Ed Richardson in the old "Covers" magazine in 1962), but only recently was fortunate enough to obtain it at auction. The cover was at one time in the collection of the late Edwin R. Payne, author of the pioneer reference work "The First Fifty Years of U.S. Exposition and World Fair Postal Markings."

The flap on the backside of this cover bears the inscription "ZERO CLUB/Dawson Y.T.," over which the letter writer, a doctor, placed his signature. One can only speculate as to the nature of the Zero Club, but it presumably was a social or civic organization in a Dawson which by 1912 was very much an ex-boomtown.

According to The Postal History of Yukon Territory by Robert G. Woodall (recently reprinted by Quarterman Publications, Inc., Lawrence, Mass.) three other covers are known bearing the publicity slogan cancellation, but none of them is an exposition publicity cover, as such. The four covers span the brief period from May 26 to June 12, 1912.

Woodall states that the device which applied this unusual slogan cancellation was made by a jewelry firm in Dawson after plans had been made for the exposition there. He indicates that, due to cost factors, the actual exposition was much reduced from the one originally planned, but did take place.

Postal records do not indicate whether or not this locally made device had the approval of the Post Office Department of Canada. However, the short period of usage could very well mean that the Department, once it learned of the local device, ordered its use discontinued.

The postal history of the Yukon Territory, conjuring up as it does all the drama and pathos of the gold rush days, is a fascinating field on which Woodall's book provides much enlightenment. This briefly used exposition slogan cancellation can perhaps be characterized as icing on the cake.

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# Postmarked OTTAWA HANS REICHE

A REGULAR FEATURE

The new 12c. coil stamps have shown up already in imperforate strips of 13, similar to the previous coils. There appears to be a fairly large number of them reported so one wonders if something went wrong again at the Bank Note Company. The prices asked for them reflect the many finds. We shall have to wait to see what develops over the next year and by that time probably another rise in postage will be in effect.

The precancelled new stamps which are now available are the 1c, 3c, 5c, 6c, 8c, caricature stamps and the 10c. flower stamp. The 10c. Queen will not be precancelled as far as we hear.

An extensive study is now under way to bring together all information on the fancy cancellations used during the Large Queen period. This is being undertaken by H. E. and H. W. Duckworth (father and son). Identification is difficult as full covers are often required for this. I am certain that they would be happy to hear from anyone with information on this subject. Correspondence should be sent to H. E. Duckworth, 49 Oak Street, Winnipeg, Manitoba, R3M 3P6.

It appears that the 1967 issue still has not been laid to rest, at least from a standpoint of paper identification. The struggle for a system of paper identification continues.

There are apparently two schools of thought on this subject. One states that papers should be classified so that collectors can identify the varieties without the aid of UV light; the other states that an UV lamp is a must. Without UV light it is felt that there cannot be a very accurate assessment of the various papers. The influence of the type of daylight, the washing of stamps, the sensitivity of one's eyes and other factors could produce misleading results. If there is a need to

identify the various paper types it can only be done with the aid of a scientific instrument.

To what detail one wishes to address the question of paper identification should be left to the individual. If a very detailed list comprising, let us say, 15 different paper types was made available, collectors could then choose to what extent they wanted to collect. It is interesting to note that this approach appears to be favoured by some of the members of the Canadian Armed Forces Philatelic Society with whom we have discussed this question.

Another field of collecting has been neglected during the past few years. Perfins were once a strong field in which Mr. R. J. Wooley was one of the key workers. The excellent little handbook on Perfins has been out of print for years and unfortunately Mr. Wooley has had to give up his many years of outstanding studies of these stamps. We noted recently an article on the 1967 Perfins (BNA Topics, May-June, 1977) and, although we have seen a few, there we were shown that 19 different types are known. Mr. D. M. Hodges is probably the only one with such a complete listing and many of them must be rare indeed.

#### The Admiral Precancels

Two outstanding philatelists have been working for many years on the identification of all Admiral precancels and were trying to list the various printings and dies which were used. Mr. F. Keane and Mr. H. Hetherington carried out this initial study and their findings were published periodically in Maple Leaves of the C.P.S. of G.B. Mr. Keane turned over his entire notes and collection to Mr. R. C. Cheshire who endeavoured to continue where the other two left off.

The writer has agreed to help Mr. Cheshire in this endeavour because it would be a great loss to allow the work of Keane and Hetherington to lapse.

Mr. Cheshire took over the master notes from Mr. Keane and has provided the writer with a duplicate set. Information on each new item found by either of us is exchanged and added to the list so that both sets of master notes are always identical and up to date.

The master notes are well organized on printed sheets. Each town is listed on a separate sheet and shows the denomination, colour, printing type and die and the Walburn catalogue type number (Official Catalog of Canada Precancels). We have also prepared simplified notes in precis form for identification of various value types and dies. The cost of these master notes, although not excessive, has to be

paid. Complete sets could be supplied against reimbursement of costs and updating could be arranged.

Over the last few years we have had considerable help from other collectors. Mr. H. G. Walburn and Mr. G. Manley have provided extensive help and we are particularly thankful to both. Nearly 300 new items, in addition to those already published on, have been added to the master notes.

We now need further help from other interested collectors. We would like to continue with follow up articles and listings and are interested in hearing from anyone with suggestions on how we should tackle the next phase of the study.

We hope this note will stimulate some interest and will let members know what work is going on behind the scenes.

With me any foreign that are purchased when buying accumulations of Canada, etc., are something to pass on in the form of clearance job lots as don't have the time to deal with them on a single or set basis. Have so much in foreigns that can even ask the buyer to state his general preferences. Send in \$100 and for this will send a group that will be worth \$200 retail easily, but to sweeten up things will throw in some good Canada odds & ends worth \$100 retail alone, at no extra charge whatsoever.

Anything I sell is always returnable for refund, provided it is returned intact and within 2 weeks of receipt.

For the collector of Canadian stamps I have

the 1851 - 1953 4th edition Canada Basic Catalogue at \$10.00

the 1953 - 1974 Elizabethan Canada Catalogue at \$10.00

The information in these booklets is invaluable, the valuations are out of date but that is the fate of any catalogue dealing with Canadian stamps. Valuations are of little use the day they appear in print.

Still my catalogues give one a good idea of what goes on. In this connection I challenge anybody, dealer or collector to sell me his 1953-1974 Canada mint accumulations based on any general catalogue. Just don't peek at my 1953-1974 book and I'll be happy. Quite OK to look at the older catalogue. Would I ever love to buy any and all at those 7 year old prices. Would especially like to hear from all those who assured me the valuations were ridiculously high. Oh well, am willing to buy all possible 1851-1880 especially, at the going current.

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Starting with this issue of the C.P. we shall be devoting appropriate space for news and views of the forthcoming CAPEX '78. Since your Society is a sponsor of this event, it is essential that you be kept up to date with plans so that you can be prepared to participate more fully in the show.

### THE SALES CIRCUIT --

Our Sales Department year is drawing to a close. I think it has been a successful one. I do know that there have been literally hundreds of sales books sent to me to be dispersed to the Chapters and to members. Buying has been quite brisk and many good stamps have changed hands.

I have had one problem, that of trying to get circuits to the individual collectors. I often run short of time and proper material. Also the rise in postage and registration costs has been a source of concern all year. It was decided at the last meeting with the Directors that individual collectors should pay the postage both ways. This would help considerably and I should be able to send to more members.

During the last year I have been sending circuits to 58 chapters, at least once each month, and to 61 members. The members did not receive a circuit each month but as many as possible were distributed.

Now, as to our plans for the fall, I would like to hear from all chapters giving me their meeting dates for 1977-78. Many have already indicated the date of their September meeting and this will be a help. I usually make up the circuits about a week and a half before what I think might be your meeting date. I often receive your return circuit with the date of the next meeting and I find I have sent your circuit either too early, too late, or find that you did not want a circuit for that month.

I would like the individual members to inform me of their current collecting interests so that I can put them on my new fall list.

I shall be returning books as fast as I can so I would ask you to be patient. I am using a different approach to this and I expect to be able to retire more books more rapidly than last year.

Now, what stamps do we need for the next year? This is where the members who send in either a few or dozens of stamp books to be sold are doing their part to keep the Sales Circuit operating smoothly. Without your help we could not continue. The response in 1976-77 has been tremendous and I hope that next year it will be the same. One word of caution however, do not send in books of stamps that are of countries other than those I have requested. They simply sit on the shelf and are never sent out as no one asks for them.

If you want to sell a few stamps which you think might sell, put them in the back of another good selling book and who knows what might happpen.

For next year we need many new books. The countries in demand are Canada, mint, used and mint never hinged. The mint never hinged are becoming increasingly popular. We really don't need many plate blocks, used blocks or booklets. The market for these is limited. Some clubs have been asking for revenues but again I do not need too many books of them unless more clubs or members request them.

Newfoundland and the Provinces are needed as these are always popular. Great Britain is in great demand and my supply of books is practically nil. Mint, used, early and modern are requested. We can use more U.S.A. and UNO, British West Indies, British Commonwealth, Oceania, Australia and New Zealand. These last two are popular countries and we never seem to have enough books. Also needed are France, Netherlands, Belgium, Scandinavia in general, Switzerland, Austria and all parts of Germany including colonies and states. I could use some books of mixed European countries other than those already indicated. There is a market for certain countries such as Greece, Russia, Italy, Spain, Vatican, etc., but not enough

to make up one whole book of each country. One club wants stamps of the Ryukyus and a few want Japan and Asia in general.

Once again I thank you all, you who sent in books and the chapters and members from all parts of Canada who bought stamps, and a special thanks to those who wrote me kind words of encouragement. We need this type of cooperation to make the R.P.S.C. Sales Department a success.

### FROM THE CHAPTERS ---

### PENTICTON AND DISTRICT STAMP CLUB, CHAP. 127 and the OKANAGEN MAINLINE PHILATELIC ASSOCIATION, CHAP. 100.

Penpex '77, the 2nd annual philatelic exhibition of the Penticton and District Stamp Club, was held in the Community Arts Auditorium in Penticton, B.C. on May 7th and 8th. Barlee of Summerland, B.C., owner and editor of the Canada West magazine, who presented an Interesting and highly enlightening account of

many of the ghost towns of British Columbia.

The annual meeting of the O.M.P.A. was held on Sunday afternoon and the following officers were elected or appointed: Fred Arnot (Penticton), president, Mrs. Joan Allen (Salmon Arm), vicepresident, Cable Freeman (Penticton), secretary, Harold Barber (Vernon), treasurer, George Douglas (Vernon), librarian, George Melvin, auctioneer, Geoff Walburn, sales table manager and Mrs. Daphne Seed, bulletin editor. # THE BOOKSHELF

NEW JERSEY POSTAL HISTORY: The Post Offices and First Postmasters 1776-1976 by John L. Kay and Chester M. Smith, Jr. Quarterman Publications, Inc., 5 South Union Street, Lawrence, MA, 01843.  $16.9 \, \text{cm.} \times 23.6 \, \text{cm.} \times i + 199 \, \text{pages, tables,}$ map, hardbound. 1977. \$20 [US] available from the publisher.

This is an original publication by the authors of Pennsylvania Postal History. It details two centuries of postal history of New Jersey starting with July 26, 1775 when the American postal service was founded. The history of all post offices, named stations, named branches, rural stations, rural branches, and community post offices are covered in the book's three main sections. These are: New Jersey post offices by county, a list of first postmasters and an alphabetical list of post offices. An introduction and bibliography complete this book which is a good starting point for studying the rest of the state's postal history, as with other Quarterman editions, this is a well printed and sturdily bound book.

PRINTERS AND PRINTING IN PHIL-ATELY by John Alden. 20.2 x 20.2 cm.; 76 pages, soft parchment card cover; published by Picton Publishing, Bath Road, Chippenham, Wilts, England SN15 2AA. Price \$2.00 plus postage.

The cover design, showing the title in large black letters in Old English wood type against a brilliant red background, is a clear indication of the excellence of detail that continues through the rest of the work.

The text itself reads like a novel with all aspects of printing - the stage, the actors, the props - forming the complete story. Stamps are used liberally as illustrations for the text. The final chapter is a checklist of stamps related to the theme of printing.

The technical aspects of manufacture complement the subject. The paper is of excellent quality and the registration of the

illustrations and the type is superb.

John Alden, the author, has spent the greater part of his life with books. He is Keeper of Rare Books, Emeritus, Boston Public Library and Bibliographer, John Carter Brown Library, Providence, R.I.

NOVA SCOTIA FAKES AND FORGERIES by Capt. R. B. Mitchell, R.D.; 15.1 x 21.6 cm., 48 pages with soft card cover. Published by Scotia Stamp Studio, 1723 Barrington Street, Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, Price \$5.00.

This work is an obvious labour of love of the author. He deals with the known fakes and forgeries of the stamps and covers of Nova Scotia with such enthusiasm that much of it is transferred to the reader. However, one need not depend upon enthusiasm to carry this work because it has been thoroughly researched, factual and comprehensive. Illustrations are profuse.

The one fault to be found is related to the illustrations. The form of reproduction used keeps the purchase price in reach of most collectors but does not offer clear, crisp reproductions. Nevertheless, they can be considered adequate and this diminishes only slightly the value of this work as an excellent reference book on this subject. FGS

REFERENCE MANUAL OF BNA FAKES. FORGERIES AND COUNTERFEITS [Release #1] by Kenneth Pugh. Page size 14.2 x 21.5 cm. loose leaf, 3 hole punched.

1L4. Price \$6.75.

At Last - a book on forgeries and fakes with enlarged, clear photographs!!! Indeed, the strength of this work lies in its illustrations with a single item on each page together with a related description.

Pages fit standard loose leaf binders.

The first release contains 50 pages of text together with tabbed card dividers. Subjects covered are diverse and related one to the other only as they apply to the title generally. We find such things as faked cancellations, overprints and tampered stamps. Also included are forgeries and counterfeits. In some instances, where applicable, photographs of normal items are included for comparison.

The author intends to issue 50 page releases at regular intervals and keep records of those who have already purchased the first one so that they may be

informed of subsequent ones.

All in all, the effort is first class. The concept is good; the photographs are excellent; the information well researched and accurate; the materials top grade. What more could anyone want?

A LARGE QUEEN'S REPORT by Hans Reiche. 15.2 x 22.8 cm., 74 pages, soft cover. Published and distributed by Canadian Wholesale Supply, P.O. Box 841, Brantford, Ontario Canada, N3T 2R7. Available from many dealers or the distributor. Price \$5.00.

Although the title implies that we are dealing with a report from oversized feminine royalty, this work actually correlates published and known information about the Large Queen Issue of Canada. It has each denomination as a separate chapter covering such things as papers, printings, usages, quantities, varieties, shades, etc.

Although the author has been relatively successful in his purpose, this work has some shortcomings as a reference manual on this interesting and challenging issue. On one hand, some of the information that is included is considered erroneous by some specialists, and some information has not been included that would have added to the total picture. Nevertheless, this can prove to be an acceptable reference book provided it is not considered the final word on the subject.

Externally, this edition of "Lyman's" seems little different from last year's. However, inside there is a difference. Naturally the prices have been changed, at least 3,522 (fewer than last year) of them have been, but the big difference is in the new illustrations which give this edition a cleaner and brighter look. The ten year price performance table which was introduced last year is repeated in this edition without change. The price changes and improved appearance are sure to keep this catalogue in first place among BNA catalogues for the general collector.

STANLEY GIBBONS FOREIGN STAMP CATALOGUE, OVERSEAS 3, K - 0, 2nd ed. Stanley Gibbons Publications Ltd., 391 Strand, London, WC2R 0LX, England. 14.8 cm. x 21.7 cm., xxii, + 694 pages, illus., index, stiff covers. 1977. £6.50 or equivalent from dealers.

This new edition up dates a range of countries from Korea to Oman representing all part of the worlds: the Orient, the Middle East, various African Territories including Morocco and Libya, a strong West African group including Liberia. Mali, Mauritania and the Niger Republic, Central America and Numerous out-of-theway and out-of-the-ordinary territories. The current state of the market is refected in the usual thorough revision of prices. Substantial increases have been made in the majority of countries, notably the Japanese Post Offices in Korea, Mexico. the Foreign P.O.s in Morocco, and the Mariana Islands Marshall Islands and New Caledonia.

The North Korean lists have been augmented and brought up to date with the addition of more than 250 new issues. Mozambique, now a People's Republic has produced several interesting new stamps, some of which are already becoming elusive. Some of the scarcer issues of Mongolia between 1924 and 1958 have

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been repriced, and new information and illustrations have been added to Macao and Marshall Island's lists. Overseas 3 includes the information for collectors which is now a regular feature of Gibbons' catalogues, an International Philatelic Glossary in five languages and the helpful complete Index to Foreign Countries.

COLLECT BRITISH STAMPS, 20th edition. Stanley Gibbons Publications Ltd., 391 Strand. London, WC2R OLX, England. 16.4 cm. x 19.4 cm., 56 pages, illus., col., stiff covers. 1977. 90p. or equivalent from many dealers.

Published during the month of the Silver Jubilee festivities, this edition includes new GB issues up to the Silver Jubilee issue of 11 May. CBS appears every six months or so and keeps collectors up-to date with the latest prices during the interim between catalogues. Among the price increase in this edition are: 1d. black unused increased by \$50 to \$400, and used it is now \$30 from \$28; the 1913-18 \$1 green "Seahorse" increase by \$50 to \$550 and the 1929 Postal Union Congress \$1 is up \$25 to \$400.

The listings cover all the basic issues of British stamps, including illustrations in colour and details of the different watermarks and perforations. It includes the regional issues and the stamps of the Channel Islands prior to postal independence, also the British postage dues and official stamps, and all the permutations of the 'Machin' definitives and phosphor bands. There are now stamps representing every ½ p step in postage from ½ p to 11p.

### THE CONFEDERATE TEN-CENT BLUE LITHOGRAPH by Brian M. Green.

This booklet by the Assistant Curator and Confederate Postal Historian is the second in a series of booklets pertaining to the general issue of the Confederate States of America. The booklet begins with a discussion of the background of this second government issue and illustrates various usages of the stamp. The final portion is devoted to a presentation and illustration of the fakes. The booklet, and all succeeding booklets, are available for \$2.00 each

postpaid. Information on the whole series may be obtained from The Philatelic Foundation, 99 Park Ave., New York, NY, 10016, U.S.A.

JUDAICA POST, edited by Dr. Eli Grad. Holy Land Judaica, 3018 Bathurst St., Toronto, Ontario, M6B 3B6. 15.6 cm. x 22.2 cm., illus., stiff covers. \$10 per year [6 issues].

"The Judaica Post: the Bimonthly Journal of Philatelic and Numismatic Judaica" received a silver bronze medal at ITALIA '77 in Milan in Oct. 1976 and has recently received a similar award at AMPHILEX '77 in Amsterdam. A perusal of the three most recent issues discloses a wealth of material presented in many well illustrated articles and short notes. The articles are too numerous to list but a sampling produces such titles as: Dr. Marcus Bloch, Ichthyologist, The History of Jewish Money, Parts 4-6, The Jew on the Map of America and Briefly Noted. The last is a regular feature with notes of general, philatelic, numismatic, biographic and other interest. This is certainly the journal for those with Judaica interests.

This is a new philatelic publication which is published irregularly by the Romanian Philatelic Club when sufficient articles are at hand. It carries no advertising and its content is restricted to studies of Romanian philately and postal history, reviews of Romanian philatelic literature, summmaries of the latest issues of FILATELIA, the Romanian philatelic magazine, information on Romania and the like.

Nr.1/1977 contains Money Order Cancellations of 1900-1920, The Romanian Stamp Catalogue, The Fournier Forgeries of the Romanian Cancellations, the 1880 Prince Carol Issue, Smithsonian Institution Misidentifies Romanian Stamp, etc.

The short notes include "The Catalogue Debate" with the editor's comments on what people have said a catalogue should be, brief notes on new Chilean issues and notes on other philatelic material from a number of Central and South American countries. It is worth looking at if your interests lie in that direction.

Meier presents a one page "Brief History of the Postal History Society" followed by 17 pages of "The Postal History Journal Checklist and Cumulative Index"; William Hagen continues to look at "Philatelic Literature Price Trends" and presents "The Philatelic Bibliopole: An interview with Leonard Hartman". These are followed by the regular features.

Philatelic Handbooks, the growing range of titles by Quarterman Publications and other well known names in the philatelic literature field.

In the area of stamps and covers, the NEWSLIST offers two pages of popular Lindbergh material, as well as items from Great Britain and other Commonwealth countries including Newfoundland, Malta, Sarawak, Southern Rhodesia, Tonga, the Caribbean islands, and also Guatemala and Liberia.

The directory includes independent publications, Society journals and major dealer house organs and wholesale publications. There are some noticable gaps, two of which have been reviewed in recent issues of the C.P., e.g., Cheng's Stamp Journal (Taiwan) and IND DAK (India). However, the lack of these and others does not detract appreciably from the usefulness of this listing.

It serves to indicate what one could expect to receive for their material in an auction or, coversely, it indicates how much one should bid in order to acquire some auction lot(s).

### FIP ISSUES NEW INFORMATION BULLETIN

The first quarter 1977 issue of "FIP INFORMATION" recently appeared in a new and larger format. It is the news bulletin of the Federation Internationale de Philatelie that is now in its fifty-first year. The bulletin is trilingual with all material appearing in French, German and English.

The main function of the FIP is regulation of international philatelic shows. The majority of its seven commissions and several working groups is concerned with that task. The recent proliferation of special sections of rules for different branches of philately proves the adaptability of the organization and its desire to serve the whole range of evolving philatelic exhibition interests. Latest to be expressly recognized are maximaphily, astrophilately, and, as a separate class, postal stationery.

Progress reports by a number of commissions and working groups, including one by a special commissioner about the expertizing process in various countries are included in the current issue. Fakes, forgeries, and repaired items as well as undesirable issues are, apart from exhibitions, the main interests of the FIP.
