#### ARE YOU HAVING ANY FUN?

Dear Friends:-

The other day I had a Toronto man call me up and ask me if we would be interested in buying a few hundred thousand Canadian stamps. The answer was "yes". In due course he brought in the stamps, and upon examining the various boxes, I found the stamps covered a period of 50 years. They had all been carefully soaked and sorted, bundled or enveloped. The condition was excellent. His inventory was exact, making my work much easier. I asked him the price he wanted, and agreed to it, and so the deal was completed very quickly.

We then had a chat, and he told me how his father had started him collecting as a boy, and that having a lot of spare time during the off seasons, he had been able to devote thousands of hours to his stamps and still enjoys collecting. However, he said that the bundles had been kicking around for a long time, and he had thought many times of disposing of them, and he was happy and relieved that we were able to buy them. The only concern was that he had no more stamps to work on, and he wanted to fill in those empty hours, so we made a quick arrangement to get him a lot of work to take home, and so now he is helping us out here at Empire.

If you are one of the people who have a lot of stamps or a collection that you more or less are tired of, and have no further use for it, why don't you make up your mind and do the same thing as this chap had done. I am sure that we would be able to help you at Empire, as we are buyers of stamps of the world in any quantities, and for virtually any amount of money. I do my best to give a fair deal.

During the month I took a one day trip by car to Windsor to look at a 50 volume collection which was most fascinating. It was virtually all Switzerland and Canada, the Swiss being housed in over 40 albums. Late the same afternoon, after loading the car I started to drive back to Toronto, stopping in London for a late dinner. On arriving in Toronto, I had to take the stamps to the office and lock them up in the vault for safekeeping, and I arrived home around midnight. Busy day!

May I give you a word of advice? During the month of September, a Toronto dealer who was away on a trip to Western Canada, had his home broken into, the safe jimmied open and a valuable lot of stamps removed. The house had been left unattended for just over two hours, so obviously it had been watched carefully, and the thieves moved in quickly when the opportunity presented itself. Don't let this happen to you. Be sure your stamps are properly insured, be sure that someone is on the premise, and if you are going away, take them down to the local bank and have them locked up.



#### THE STAMP ON THE CEILING

No doubt you have heard or read about the room of stamps, the one that was reported to be papered in its entirity with used postage stamps. Here is another room and stamp story but only one, not thousands of stamps, is involved. Ian Sproat, Dairy Road, Edinburgh, works for a large interior decorating firm.

Recently they had a contract to redecorate a stately home in Perthshire.

It was a difficult job because of high ceilings and intricate plasterwork. But the strangest instruction came from the Laird.

There was a Penny Black postage stamp, more than a hundred years old, stuck on the drawing room ceiling which on no account must be covered.

Naturally, Ian asked how it came to be on the ceiling.

"It is a strange story", said the Laird, "but I can assure you it's true."

It seems that one of his ancestors was an inveterate gambler and one night he had a terrible run of bad luck.

Before the evening was out, he had wagered the house and estate and had lost the wager. All he had left was a half sovereign and a postage stamp.

He asked the man who had won for a chance to get back at least the house and the land. The gambler agreed but stated that he would decide the bet.

After a bit of thought, he said, "I bet you can't fix that stamp to the ceiling without using a ladder before I count to twenty."

The old boy was quick witted. He picked up the stamp. licked it on both sides and laid it face down on the half sovereign.

He then threw the coin up to the ceiling. Luckily, it hit the ceiling just right. The stamp stuck and the coin fell back to the men's feet.

The house and estate were won back but it was the last game of cards that the Laird played for the rest of his life. And the proof is still sticking to the ceiling of that Perthshire mansion.

## THE MAILBAG

In spite of reports to the contrary, collectors with "Collectors' Subscription Service" accounts are still experiencing excessively long delays in the service. For example, we received this copy of a letter to Mr. J. D. Garmaise, Supt., Philatelic Service, Ottawa.

"Dear Mr. Garmaise:

"Two months ago I wrote your office a note requesting whether or not my standing order was or was not to be filled in regard to the floral low value definitives. To date no reply has been received.

"Since this is no more than experience wirh the so-called "Service" has led me to expect, I tried to obtain these products. FDCs and plate blocks from the two "local" philatelic counters. In Victoria there is (apparently) no stock of these items, and in Duncan the clerk is on holidays, having left a pathetic small supply of products for her replacement, thus no satisfaction there either.

"We are now going on three years, form-letters assuring some improved "service" notwithstanding, in which the socalled service is a pathetic exercise in frustration, in which one sees advertisements (e.g., in the Canadian Philatelist) from which I quote: "FLEXIBLE: Want something special? No problem. Just let us know by letter, phone or order form." "My dear Sir, April Fool's Day is in the Spring!

"I am enclosing a cheque for deposit to my account, and a "special order form" for some products, including the ones mentioned above. Please, for this once, try to have the items reach me by Christmas as they are needed as presents. Last year some Olympic products, ordered in June, arrived (after numerous unanswered letters to your office) in January."

#### **Great Britain Cancels, A Correction** One way to Do It: How to get S.O.N. Cancels

"With reference to the article by Mr. S. T. Maps under this heading in your issue of May-June 1977, I would like to draw attention to an inaccuracy regarding G.B. stamp cancelling practice appearing in the

pen-ultimate paragraph.

"In late 1976, instructions were issued by our Postal Headquarters that the circular date and town stamp should be on the left so that it could more clearly read the details for Post Office monitoring and control. This change is set out in the Philatelic Bulletin of February 1977.

"Far from Philatelic Clubs having any influence over this decision it is disliked by collectors and the only way round it is to place stamps about two inches from the right-hand side of the envelope though tis is frowned upon by the authorities being contrary to regulations requiring stamps to be affixed in the top right-hand corner of envelopes.

"I would, however, mention that sometimes special consideration is given to philatelists. In March this year, I posted three letters with our Chemistry commemoratives, placing the stamps a good two inches from the right-hand side so that I would have S.O.N. cancels. However, the Office cancelling the stamps had overlooked the instructions to alter their cancelling machines and my stamps arrived with a slogan cancellation. I protested and the Post Office provided me with three new envelopes and stamps which then had S.O.N. cancels, at no cost to me."

Editor's note: Perusal of mail from Great Britain certainly verifies Mr. Alsop's information regarding the position of the slogan portion of cancellations. Philatelic mail from Jersey, however, does have the usual positions reversed as does some mail from France and Switzerland.

It is proposed to publish the second handbook on the Map Stamp. In this book, it is hoped to study and list all of the various known types of cancels used throughout Canada during the period of major use of the stamp. Considering the vast numbers and many varities of cancels, no one collector or group of collectors could hope to accumulate all the known cancels that exist. Therefore, a request is being made to all collectors to check and compile lists of all cancels on the Map stamp, in their collections, of the following types of cancels:

Squared Circles
Rollers
Fancy Corks
Precancels
Railway Post Offices
Duplexes
Perfins
Coloured Cancels

Any other unusual cancels, forged cancellations, or forgeries of the stamp.

Am picking up shortly a splendid lowa estate lot with excellent Canada & B.N.A., very strong in U.S.A. (Columbus, Zepps complete etc., etc.) and about 100 volumes of fine older British Colonies, Scandinavian, etc. etc. In addition there is nearly a ton of U.S.A. silver and copper coins. Coins are not exactly my field but then when available, I never turn down anything valuable. Enquiries for all welcome.

#### Canada First Day Covers

Outside of the annual Christmas First Day Covers, I have not handled F.D.C. to any extent due to lack of time. It is an exhaustive and very costly business to look after the F.D.C. of Canadian stamps, one reason why there is not now one single dealer in all of Canada giving a complete service for F.D.C. Fortunately the Canadian P.O. does look after this and their rates for fine cacheted covers are reasonable.

One of the two main suppliers in the past was Robert W. Cole, a first rate artist, who designed his own covers (he was the military cartographer for the Canadian Armed Forces). Cole covers were a fixture between 1953 and 1970 and were an artsitic delight. I have just purchased the entire stock Mr. Cole had when he retired and will offer it in suitable parcels at about 1/3rd the current retail.

#### THE REGISTERED LETTER STAMPS OF CANADA

(Part 1)

#### by Dr. Robert A. Chaplin

Registration of letters, as we know it, was introduced in Canada on 1 May 1855. The prepayment of the registration charge has always been compulsory. Registered letter stamps were issued on 15 November 1875 to facilitate prepayment. They were available until 1894.

The first record of the intention to provide special stamps to prepay the registration charge is in the report of the postmaster general for year ending 30 June 1872, dated at Ottawa 1 March 1873.

"It seems expedient to adopt some distinctive postage stamps to be used only in prepayment of the Registration charge, both to make it clear that this charge has been duly paid and accounted for in every case, and to diminish the risk which is occasionally felt at points of distribution of omitting to carry on the Registration in cases where the ordinary Registration postmark is not as distinct and calculated to assert attention as it should be."

There was a delay in the introduction of these stamps. In the report of the postmaster general for the year ending 30 June 1875, dated at Ottawa 20 January 1876, it is stated that, "Registration stamps have been issued, to be used by the public in prepaying the registration charges on letters passing within the Dominion, or to the United Kingdom or United States, each destination being distinguished by a different color in the stamp, as well as by a

variation in the amount of registration charge and corresponding value of the stamps.

'There is a red stamp of the value of two cents for prepayment of the registration charges on letters within the Dominion.

"There is a green stamp of five cents value for registered letters addressed to the United States.

"There is a blue stamp of eight cents value for registered letters addressed to the United Kingdom.

"These stamps are to apply exclusively to the registration charges and the postage rates on registered letters are to be prepaid by the ordinary postage stamps.

"It is believed that the use of these distinctive stamps for the registration charges, will tend to give registered letters additional security against the risk which is sometimes felt of the registration escaping observation, when such letters are dealt with hurriedly at night whilst passing through the post."

The registered letter stamps were intended to be used only to prepay the registration charge on letters to these three specific areas. Department order number eighteen dated at Ottawa 7 January 1876 directs that the registered letter stamps were to be used exclusively to prepay the registration charge on domestic letters, letters to the United States of America and on letters to the United Kingdom and that,

"on letters for other destinations the registration charges are so various that it was not deemed expedient to furnish specific stamps for these, and such charges will have to be prepaid by ordinary postage stamps heretofore."

Department order number eighteen also directed that the registered letter stamps were not to be used to prepay the postage. There are exceptions to these regulations. It is not uncommon to find postage stamps used to prepay registration and sometimes one finds registered letter stamps used to prepay both the registration charge and the

postage.

The registration charge for parcel post was five cents. The Dominion of Canada Official Postal Guide, vol. 1, no. 1, October 1875 states "Parcels may be registered on affixing thereto a five cents registered letter stamp, in addition to stamps representing the postage." This was changed and the postmasters were notified in department order number eighteen dated at Ottawa 7 January 1876, that the five cents registered letter stamp was only to be used to prepay the registration charges on letters to the United States of America. The Dominion of Canada Official Postal Guide. vol. 3. no. 1, October 1877 states, "on a parcel or packet of patterns or samples addressed to any part of Canada the registration fee is five cents, but this fee must be paid in ordinary postage stamps, the five cents registration stamp being intended for United States letters only.' The regulations were again changed and the similar postal guide vol.1, no.4, July 1882 states, "On a parcel or packet of patterns or samples addressed to any part of Canada the registration fee is five cents, this fee must be paid by a five cents registration stamp."

The registration charge to the United Kingdom was reduced to five cents. This probably occurred on 1 January 1878. "The eight cents was withdrawn from circulation in January 1878." (1).

Howes quotes the Stamp Journal issued in 1878, "After January 1878 the cost of registering letters to Great Britain has been fixed at 5 cents, the same as to the United States." (2). Harrison records, "The Postal Guide, dated October 1877,

shows the fee as 8 cents, but the Guide, stated Jan. 1, 1878, shows the fee as 5 cents." (3). No eight cents registered letter stamps were issued after 1878.

The Post Office Act of 1889, effective 8 May, increased the domestic registration rate to five cents. "The fee for the registration of a letter or other article of mail matter will be five cents upon all classes of correspondence passing within the Dominion . . . For the present, and until further instructed, the registration fee may be prepaid by using the two cents Registration stamps and postage stamps to make up the amount."

In 1876 there were 937,000 two cents registered letter stamps issued. This steadily increased to 2,858,900 in 1888 and 2,808,400 in 1889. There was a decrease to 601,750 in 1890, 14,850 in 1891, only 100 in 1892 and a single group of 400 in 1896. No two cents registered letter stamps were received by the postmaster general after 1890.

Finally in August 1893, the eight cents small queen stamps were issued to prepay




Fig. 1. Complete sheet of fifty stamps printed from re-entered plate.

both the registration charge and the postage. The registered letter stamps were discontinued and the last 307,900 of the five cents value were issued in 1894. The registered letter stamps have not been demonitized.

The total number issued were approximately 29,500,000 two cents, 12,500,000 five cents and 90,000 eight cents of which Howes states 40,000 were recalled and destroyed. (4).

In 1875 a plate was made for each denomination. In 1878 the plate for the eight cents was scrapped. The plate for the two cents was re-entered in 1886 and the second plates for each of the two and five cents were made that year. In 1888 plate one for the five cents was re-entered and plate three laid down.

The original plates consisted of fifty subjects arranged in ten horizontal rows of five each. Boggs' type five imprint, British American Bank Note Co. Montreal, is in each of the four margins. The printing is colorless letters in a colored bar (in intaglio) with two thin frame lines surrounding it. There are counters in the upper margins. The two cents plate has TWO CENTS in the upper left margin and the numeral 2 in the right upper margin. The five cents plate has the word FIVE in the upper left margin and no numeral counter. The eight cents plate is similar to the two cents plate with EIGHT CENTS in the left upper margin and the numeral 8 in the upper right margin.

When the plates were re-entered the marginal marks were not strengthened and consequently appear worn on sheets printed from the re-entered plates. In some instances it is very difficult to recognize the frame lines that surround the imprint. The reversed letter R is in the upper margin above the imprint on the re-entered plate one of the five cents.

#### STAMPS FOR THE DAY

By Beverlie A. Clark

Ki'i Statue and Temple City of Refuge, Honaunau, Hawaii [Scott No. C-84]

Honaunau's City of Refuge was really not a city in the sense of a large centre of population organized as a community. It was a sanctuary for refugees fleeing the wrath of an avenger. With the exception of a few priests, the population was strictly transient, an endless cycle of refugees seeking protection.

The City of Refuge, more properly called the Place of Refuge, at Honaunau, or in Hawaiian, Pu'uhonua-o-Honaunau, is located on a six-acre shelf of ancient lava, that dips into the Pacific Ocean, on the island of Hawaii, the most southeastern island of the Hawaiian chain.

A pu'uhonua was a sacred refuge established by a ruling king, and operated in conjunction with a heiau (temple), whose gods protected the place of refuge and whose priests ran it. It is not known when the first refuge temple was built but the stones from its platform were used, about 1550, to build the second temple 'A-lealea. A third temple, Ka Iki 'A-lea-lea, but better known as Hale-o-Keawe or the House of Keawe, was built about 1650 in honour of King Keawe-i-Kekahi-alii-o-ka-moku, who reigned in Kono, and was in use until 1819. Honaunau was the tradititional seat of the Kingdom of Kona.


The gods of the Place of Refuge were the spirits of the dead chiefs. Upon their death certain chiefs underwent a process of deification. The last deification of a chief took place in 1818 for a son of Kamehameha the Great. By that year the bones of at least twenty three deified kings and chiefs of old Hawaii were inside the thatched temple.

Until 1778, when James Cook first stumbled upon it, Hawaii was the most isolated archipelago in the world, with a way of life that had not changed in over a thousand years. The social system was feudal, but not primitive. Political sovereignty was divided among the different island chiefs, who ruled by divine right, tracing their descent from the gods. The culture and religion was governed by a rigid code of kapus or taboos. Death was the punishment of kapu breakers. Tribal wars were part of the politics, and the object of such wars was extermination of all opponents.

Defeated warriors, noncombatants and kapu breakers escaped death if they reached the sacred land, the Place of Refuge. To violate its sanctity was one of the greatest crimes of which a man could be guilty. All refuge seekers were admitted, those from any part of the island or from another island, there was no trial to



establish their guilt or innocence. War refugees stayed until the conflict was over, kapu breakers until they were purified by the priests, usually after a few hours or overnight. When they left the protection went with them and they were free to return home in peace.

The Place of Refuge is guarded on two sides by the sea and island by a great stone wall of expertly fitted lava rocks. Built in 1550, it averages ten feet in height, seventeen feet in width, and over one thousand feet in length. The largest stone in the face of the wall is six and one-half feet high, more than five feet wide, and two feet thick, weighing between four and six tons. Early Hawaiian builders lacked metal tools or wheeled vehicles, and worked only with wooden instruments, and the stones were laid without mortar.

As a further measure of protection for the sacred group, the snarling faces of the Ki'i, wood-sculptured representatives of the old gods of Hawaii (as pictured in the foreground of this stamp) guarded the inland entrance. Set on poles high above the temple compounds, they struck fear and awe into the minds of the people and warned against intrusion onto sacred ground.

Although Kamehameha the Great of the kingdom of Kona united all the islands under one kingdom between 1792 and 1810, it was his son, Kamehameha II, who radically altered the way of life by abolishing kapus and idolatry throughout the islands. But because the bones of his ancestors and relatives were deposited there, the Hale-o-Keawe was not destroyed in 1819 along with the other temples. However, the bones of the deified chiefs and kings were removed in 1829 and the temple was razed leaving only the stone platform.

After the Kamehameha dynasty ended, the islands passed from the status of a kingdom to that of a republic in 1894, to a United States Territory in 1900, and finally to the 50th State of the U.S.A. in 1959. Today capitalism has replaced feudalism and oligarchy has supplanted monarchy.

Of the six refuges on Hawaii and of the one in every major district of the other

inhabited islands of the Hawaiian chain, the City of Refuge at Honaunau is the only one which has lasted almost intact and is the most important historically.

The place of refuge itself, the adjacent palace grounds, the royal fishponds, the nearby stone platform on which stood the houses of important chiefs, and the temple structures, are all within the National Historical Park which was established on July 1, 1961.

The island of Hawaii, more often referred to as the "Big Island", has other noteworthy points of interest. Here, Mauna Kea stands as the world's tallest mountain, rising 33,746 feet from its submarine base. It has two active volcanoes, Mauna Loa and Kilauea, home of Pele, goddess of volcanoes, one of the four Polynesian gods most fervently worshipped in old Hawaii.

Just north of the City of Refuge, at the edge of Kealakekua Bay, stands the British monument, erected in 1874, in memory of the great circumnavigator and discoverer of Hawaii, Capt. James Cook. Cook's tragic death occurred on February 14, 1779, in a skirmish with the natives over a stolen cutter and partly because he was mistaken for Lono, the god of agriculture.

This 11c. multicoloured stamp, designed by Paul Roberts, was issued by the U.S.A. on May 3, 1972, to commemorate the centennary of National Parks. A total of 78,210,000 copies were lithographed and engraved (Giori) from plates of 200 subjects in four panes of 50 each, with plate numbers appearing in all four corners, top and bottom, and marginal strips with "Mr. Zip" and "Use Zip Codes" as well as "Mail Early in the Day". The perforation was 11. First day covers numbered 364,816.

#### **MACABRE STAMPS**

#### **Additional Austrian Examples**

by P. M. Mann

In 1975, R. E. Florida wrote a series of articles on Macabre Stamps in his "Wanders of the World" column in the C.P. Part 4 (Can. Phil., May-June, 1975) included a rather grotesque stamp from Austria which had been issued for their 1973 campaign against drug abuse. As can be seen in Fig. 1, it depicts a woman's head, the right side of which is in the form of a skull while the rest is depicted in blood red. The effect is very startling and arresting.

Although I do not search out macabre stamps as a matter of course, this one attracted my attention because of the design and the effective use of the colours. While searching through Scott's Catalogue for its number, a second Austrian stamp (Fig. 2) caught my eye. It too was issued for a purpose — the obligatory use of automobile seat belts in 1975. The message is self explanatory.

With these two stamps Austria did not abandon the macabre as Fig. 3 clearly shows. Their 1976 stamp for the fight against cancer goes even further, at least in my opinion, than did their drug abuse campaign stamp.

In the 1976 stamp, cancer is depicted as a crab (Cancer) with the devil's face in red with pale green eyes. In the devil's mouth

The seriousness which collectors in Germany give to their hobby may be seen in the Michel Germany specialized catalogue. A very large number of modern German stamps are listed with higher prices for the used copies than for the mint copies. The majority collect mint and the used commemoratives disappear rapidly in the mails. Most dealers do not even bother to hold recent issues because sorting and cleaning them reduces the already limited profit margin. However, the catalogue editors have taken notice of the situation and their pricing indicates the difficulty of obtaining these stamps in fine used condition. Many recent Canadian commemoratives probably should be listed in a similar fashion.

Since the two dollars Quebec stamp has been sold out for some time, and the post office has issued two new printings of the one dollar stamp, it will be interesting to see if a replacement will be made in some form or other. A three or a five dollars stamp is still being debated.

Although the new 10c. precancelled stamp has been out for many months, the Philatelic Service only received their supplies of it in September. What governs the release of such items is not clear, but many of the unusual items appear to be available to collectors only after they have already been marketed for some time.

To advertise their country and their stamps, Switzerland issued a free small brochure called "PTT Presents Switzerland Seen Through Her Stamps". The first page shows the national emblem, the second page, the historical background, then the land and its people, Polyglot Switzerland, Culture, Customs and Traditions, Education, Citizen and State, Agriculture, Economy, Tourism and Traffic Communication, Switzerland International Mission and the PTT Philatelic Bureau. Each page shows the appropriate stamps in

colour and the last one gives the various cities where philatelic bureaus are located with one stamp for each city. It is a very nice memento.

Visiting the Philatelic Museum in Edinburgh recently, we noticed a nice exhibit on British achievement in chemistry and one on Nobel Prize winners prepared by a member of a society in the city. These exhibits are changed frequently and clubs are asked to participate in preparing them.

Many collectors who have bid in auctions in the UK have sometimes wondered why they did not get a certain lot. We now find that some auction houses have marked in their auction catalogues the latest estimated realization price in addition to the prices they had listed already. This estimated price is taken from bids received and collectors coming to the auction houses may see the marked up catalogues. As we do not see the new estimated prices, we are at a great disadvantage. One company has now prepared a special card with which one may get a valuation of a lot prior to the auction. But here again, time is against us as the catalogue is amended almost daily.

Without announcement, two new values of Postage Dues have been issued; a 20c. and a 24c. denomination. New stationery is now being prepared also.

We have taken a few interesting facts from a study carried out for the United Kingdom Postmaster General, the Rt. Hon. Herbert Samuel. The postage rates for a letter in 1839, just before the major reductions were introduced by Rowland Hill, were:



The number of letters carried during these early periods is rather astonishing, especially in view of the very fast delivery of such a large volume of mail compared to the present lamentable service.

In 1839, 76 million letters were mailed. In 1840, 169 million letters were mailed. This quantity rose slowly during the next years to reach averages as follows:

227 million for 1841 to 1845 327 million for 1846 to 1850 410 million for 1851 to 1855 521 million for 1856 to 1860 and 630 million for 1861 to 1864

The volume of mail reached about 1 billion during 1879 and almost 3 billion in 1909. When the postcard was introduced in 1870, some reduction in the quantity of letters was noticed but 1871 recorded about 75 million postcards mailed.

Initially there was no charge for the card, only the stamp imprinted on it. Later, a charge of ½d for a dozen cards was made. After the introduction of the private postcard, they formed about 90 per cent of inland postcards. Almost 900 million were mailed around 1909.

The letter card, issued in 1892, was also popular and over 6 million were mailed around 1909. The cards at that time cost 9d for eight cards.

Embossed envelopes were first issued on 1 Jan. 1841. The ½d commercial type envelopes were printed in a quantity of 8,836,560. The foolscap envelopes -1,178,640; the 1d envelope size A had a printing of 9,238,080 and the commercial type 6,434,400. These quantities are for 1909. The number of wrappers issued in 1909 was 35,979,600 at a cost of 4d for 7.

Sir Rowland Hill established the Book Post for the benefit of education and literature. It was later called Halfpenny Packet Post. Again the large numbers of such mailings are of interest. 1872-1876 ave. 143 millions 1877-1882 ave. 224 millions 1882-1887 ave. 323 millions 1887-1892 ave. 441 millions 1892-1895 ave. 570 millions 1895-1900 ave. 679 millions 1900-1906 ave. 811 millions and 1906-1910 ave. 950 millions

The newspaper rate was ½d regardless of weight. A newspaper was defined as "wholly or in great part of political or other news, or of articles relating thereto, or to other current events." Between 1872 and 1876 the average mailed was 117 millions and this rose to 197,700,000 around 1909.

Parcel post rates were changed rather frequently. In 1886, for example, a parcel weighing 7 pounds cost 1s to mail. In 1886 this was changed to 1/1½d; in 1897 it became 10 d and then 8d in 1906. About 109,436,000 parcels were passed around 1909.

A letter express service was introduced in London on 25 March 1891. Two miles was the maximum distance when there was no public conveyance. In 1895 it was extended to 3 miles for which a messenger might go on foot if the packets did not exceed 5 pounds in weight. The charges for this service were 3d for one mile, 6d for two miles and 1s for 3 miles. Around this time it was also provided that live creatures and liquids might be conveyed by this express.

The so called Penny Post, always thought to have been invented by Rowland Hill, actually was founded by Dockwra in 1680 for the local post in London. In 1764

authorization was given to setup the local penny post in all cities and towns. A village generally employed its own messenger. Wealthy people made special arrangements for themselves. In 1801 the penny post became the two penny post.

The travelling post office was suggested by F. Karstadt and in 1838 a sorting carriage was run between Birmingham and Liverpool. This proved so successful that other lines, such as between Birmingham and London, were established.

In 1906 the British delegation to the UPU put forward a scheme for the prepaying of a reply to a letter. This was adopted by the UPU and in 1908 about 32,000 of these reply coupons were issued and about 54,000 were received and exchanged in the United Kingdom.

Because of frequent thefts of letters containing money, Mr. Gosnell, an accountant of Crutched Friars, proposed in 1791, a system similar to the present money orders. Although the post office was in favour of its adoption, legal advisers doubted if the Postmaster General had the power to adopt it. Six Clerks of the Roads proposed another scheme to undertake the

money order plan and this was sanctioned in 1792. This scheme was not very successful and, following a heavy loss, was given up by the Clerks in 1798. Only in 1838 did the government take over this operation.

Statistics tell of the revenue, or the net income of the Post Office. In 1649 this was £5,000 and rose to £4,910,794 in 1909. This figure is not very high considering the large volume carried, but the continuous reduction in postage rates also reduced the income.

#### PRECANCEL VARIETY DISCOVERED

Of considerable interest to precancel collectors will be the recent discovery of an unusual variety of the 8c. Queen Elizabeth precancel stamp featuring a portrait of Oueen Elizabeth.

When the 8c. precancel stamp went on sale on 5 November 1976 at the philatelic counter in the Postal Museum it was eventually discovered that the top row of 10 stamps on each sheet had a missing perforation across the stamps resulting in an elongated stamp, 2 mm higher than the normal stamp. The photo of this unusual variety shows the elongated stamp with the missing row of perforations.

It was assumed that this variety was constant but as the supplies became exhausted, and new stamps were received by the Museum's philatelic outlet it was found that the sheets were all normal. A check at the other philatelic outlet in Ottawa, "Station 'B' ", ascertained that they also received and sold a number of sheets containing the error.

No report has been received that the errors were found in other outlets in Canada.

In determining how this variety occurred it is assumed that the sheets were fed inadvertently into the perforating machine 2 mm higher than normally. However, it is possible that the printers, The Canadian Bank Note Co. of Ottawa, will have another explanation of how the missing perforations across the sheet occurred.

According to Art Kollmann of Ottawa (1) this variety is very scarce. It is estimated that 300 to 600 panes of 100 stamps were sold to the public by the philatelic sales counter at the Museum. This would mean that approximately 3,000 to 6,000 copies of this variety are in philatelic hands. It is most likely that precancel collectors would want a marginal pair of this variety or perhaps a marginal block of four showing the location of the abnormal stamps with the normal stamps immediately below it. This will mean fewer stamps of this variety

# FLUORESCENCE OF CANADIAN STAMP PAPERS

The brightness of the fluorescence of stamp papers under ultra violet light is related to the percentage of recycled paper that is incorporated into the stamp paper.

Recycled paper is bleached to remove the inks and it is the bleaching agent that fluoresces under UV light. Therefore, dull paper is made from virgin pulp, fluorescent paper contains a smaller percentage of recycled pulp than does Hi-brite paper which obviously contains a very high percentage of recycled pulp.

A new 25 cents aerogramme featuring the Tom Thomson painting, Summer Day, is being supplied to post offices across the country as their old stock of aerogrammes is used up.

### 1977 ISSUES TO APPEAR

By the time you receive this issue of the Canadian Philatelist, the 1977 Christmas stamps will have appeared. There will be three stamps, 10c., 12c. and 25c. denominations, issued on 26 October. The designs are based on the first Canadian "Jesous Ahatonhia" Christmas carol which was originally written in the Huron language by Father Jean de Brebeuf. It has since been translated into both English and French, both of which versions are well known today. All three of these languages will appear on the stamps, making them the first trilingual stamps by the Canada Post Office.

The stamps were designed by Ronald G. White of Stroud, Ontario and were printed

by five colour lithography in panes of 50 stamps by the Canadian Bank Note Company.

We will finally see the medium value definitives which have been delayed due to labour problems at the printers. We have also learned that there will be only three stamps issued, 50c., 60c. and 75c. denominations, not four stamps of 45, 50, 60 and 75 cents denominations as announced by the Canada Post Office earlier this year.





### CAPEX '78 INTERNATIONAL JURY

CAPEX '78 organizers have announced the composition of the International Jury that has been appointed to judge the 3500 frame exhibition.

The inclusion for the first time in North America of a special class for Postal History has drawn over 120 different exhibits to this category. 


## THE SALES CIRCUIT--

Erratum. In the last issue we published a review of John Alden's book "Printers and Printing in Philately". We have learned that the cost of the book should read £2.35 (\$4.50) postpaid and is available from Vera Trinder Ltd., 38 Bedford St., Strand, London WC2E 9EU, England.

We have recently received issues 12 - 14 of Post West (Vol. 3, Nos. 2-4). Contrary to reports that may be current, the editor, Del Allen, states that he has no intention of

discontinuing Post West.

As the title of the journal indicates, Post West contains material on Western Canada postal history. It is available by subscription only at the following rates: Vols. 1-3, \$6 each; Vol. 4 \$7.50, and Vols. 4-6 (3 year subscription) \$21.00. THE LOW VALUE DEFINITIVES OF 1973 - 1976: A LISTING OF PAPER VARIETIES by Andrew Chung. 21.6 cm x 27.9 cm, 19 pages, illus, loose leaf. 1977. \$2.50 postpaid from Saskatoon Coin and Stamp Centre Ltd., 217 - 23rd Avenue, Saskatoon, Sask., S7K 0J3.

Mr. Chung has done a service to collectors of Canadian stamps by making available to all, the results of his research of these 1973-76 definitives. He has provided these data in tabular form which indicate the paper characteristics under UV light and under visible light and relates these to the source of his material philatelic stock, non-philatelic stock and precancelled stamps. Each value of sheet stock stamps from 1c. to 10c. has a single page devoted to it. The 8c. and 10c. coils stamps are combined on one page. Five pages cover the booklet - both the stamps and covers under UV and visible light with comments on the gum and sealing strips.

This is an excellent first study which will

be used as a base for further studies on these issues by Mr. Chung and others.

THE NATIONAL POSTAL MUSEUM / LE MUSEE NATIONAL DES POSTES. National Postal Museum. Confederation Heights, Ottawa, Ontario, K1A 0B1. 22.9 cm x 15.2 cm, 50 pages, bilingual, illus., col., flexible card covers. 50c. [2 International Reply Coupons outside of Canada] from the National Postal Museum.

This 50 page booklet is a reversible-type bilingual publication that begins with notes on clay tablets and follows with notes on Canada's first postage stamp. Other sections deal with the National Stamp Collection and other museum collections, displays and artifacts that are or will be on display in the present museum or the museum's future enlarged quarters in downtown Ottawa. That new Museum will probably be opened late in 1978.

An interesting booklet.

STANLEY GIBBONS BRITISH COMMON-WEALTH STAMP CATALOGUE 1978 [80th edition]. Stanley Gibbons Publications Ltd., 291 Strand, London WC2R OLX, England. 17.7 cm x 23.3 cm, xxvi + 990 pages, illus., hardbound, 1977. £6.95 or equivalent from dealers.

Aside from the expected price increases, particularly the substantial rises in classical material, many of the listings have been improved. "Specimen" stamps have been reviewed with some being added and others deleted. King George V definitives have been revised with particular attention paid to those of Bechuanaland, Hong Kong and Seychelles. The GB postal fiscal stamps have been rewritten in the normal style, replacing the previous condensed tabuated list. The Indian Feudatory States listings, particularly Jasden, Nawanager and Travancore, have been reviewed and

expanded or otherwise as required. In the New Zealand listing, recognition has been given to the three types of single "NZ and Star" watermarks, the 1882-97 "Postage & Revenue" issue, the Postage Dues, Officials, Life Insurance and Postal Fiscal stamps, with revisions including new illustrations where necessary. Other areas that have been revised are the Cook Islands, Niue, Samoa, Nova Scotia, Rhodesia and South Australia.

A sampling of price revisions clearly illustrates the substantial price rises that have been incorporated in this edition; the 1977 prices are in brackets: GB No. 1 £850 (£600); GB No. 137M £2000 (£1200), U £500 (£359); Australia 358M £9(£6), 359M £30(£15), 360M £75 (£45); Canada No. (3d red) M £3750 (£2750), U £225 (£200); No. 4 (12d black)M £25,000 (£20,000), U £23,000 (£18,000); No. 284 (50c. Bluenose)M £100 (£40), U £20 (£11); 433 (\$1 Fish)M £40 (£15), U £4.50 (£2.50).

This is a most useful catalogue for beginning and experienced collector alike.

HARRIS REFERENCE CATALOG OF POSTAGE STAMP PRICES OF THE UNITED STATES, UNITED NATIONS, CANADA AND PROVINCES, Fall/Winter 1977-78 Edition. H. E. Harris & Co., Inc., Dept. BNF, Boston, MA 02117, U.S.A. 13.5 cm x 21 cm, 218 pages + 3 order sheets, illus., fexible card covers, 1977. \$[US]1.95 + 50c. postage and handling from the publisher or equivalent from dealers.

This familiar and popular catalog, like all catalogues published this year, reflects the rapid and often substantial price rises, in this case 10,000 changes have been incorporated. A few examples of Canadian stamp prices will indicate the range of changes to expect: No. 1 (3d red) \$400, No. 158 (50c. Bluenose)M \$175, No. 302 (\$1 Fish) M \$75.

In addition to the up dated listings for the countries indicated by the title, this catalogue contains the other useful sections that have appeared in previous editions, i.e., the U.S. Stamp Identifier, list of Harris Albums, Collecting Kits, Accessories and Supplies. The catalogue should be available from local dealers, if not, it may be obtained by order from the publisher.

STAMP AUCTION PRICES REALIZED, VOL. 1.UNITED STATES, CANADA. [The Green Book of Stamps] 5th edition. APR Publishers, Inc., P.O. Box 5075, Fresno, CA 93755, U.S.A. 15 cm x 20 cm, xxviii + 202 pages, flexible covers, plastic ring bound, 1977. \$[US] 10.00 from the publisher.

The Green book of Stamps, one of a series of similar books on stamps of other country groups, is a useful adjunct to whatever catalogue one uses, particularly if one acquires or seeks to acquire stamps through auctions. The listing in book represents a compilation from 135 public auctions held by 19 auction houses in the U.S.A. and Canada (1 only, J. N. Sissons Ltd.) from Sept. 1, 1976 through Aug. 28, 1977

The stamps listed are those that catalogue at least \$10 and represent individual prices if offered at 4 or less auctions. If the same stamp appeared in more than four auctions, the low, median and high realizations are listed. The prices given are grouped according to condition of the stamps with those in the "Superb" catagory in a separate list in the appendix.

Damaged, regummed, reperforated stamps and those with short or missing perfs., soiled or foxed, creases or thins, are not listed unless the condition is noted in the text.

The book contains useful introductory sections such as: comments on auction buying, principles followed in preparing the book; a few tips on using the list and in bidding in auctions. A new section which appears for the first time is a "Five-Year Market Analysis: 1973 - 1977" which analyses U.S.A. stamps and Canadian stamps separately and in chronological groupings. Percentage increases are given plus several individual examples for each of the 5 years.

In general, Canadian stamps showed better performance than those of the United States. Unusual VF Jubilees showed average increases of 200% while later issues "were even stronger than the Jubilees and stronger than comparable U.S. issues" . . . the increase of all Canadian 20th century stamps is over 260%

Some earlier editions of this and other volumes in the series are available from the publisher for \$2.50 while supplies last.

INTERPHILA '77: ADRESSBUCH DER PHILATELIE UND NUMISMATIK, 15th edition. Verlag Ludwig Helwig, Spatzenweg 11, Postfach 17, 821 Prien/Chiemsee, West Germany. 14.5 cm x 20.8 cm, 472 pages, flexible card covers. 1977. DM 18 [\$8.55] from the publisher.

Interphila is an annual directory of philately and numismatics which has its greatest concentration on Germany collectors, shops, journals, etc., but has substantial listings from other parts of Europe and the rest of the world.

Following some hints for exchanging, there are 254 two column pages of addresses of philatelists arranged according to country of interest. These are followed by ten pages of numismatists' addresses. The two lists make up the bulk of the book. The rest provides addresses of stamp shops (66 pages), coin shops (8 pages), 'special firms (2 pages), Publishers (2 pages), Expertizing offices, rules and definitions (36 pages), Philatelic Clibs and Organizations (44 pages), Numismatic Clubs (5 pages), Philatelic and Numismatic Agencies (6 pages) and Stamp and Coin Journals (4 pages).

If one is interested in exchanges or, if travelling, in Europe in particular, this is a useful directory.

Additions to an/or corrections to this directory can be made, at no charge, by submitting the appropriate information to the publisher by Dec. 31, 1977. Such information will then be included in the 16th edition to be published March/April 1978.

STAMP COLLECTOR'S HANDBOOK, A VALUABLE STOREHOUSE OF PHILA-TELIC KNOWLEDGE FOR PLEASURE OR FOR INVESTMENT, revised 16th printing by Samuel Grossman. Grossman Stamp Co., Inc., 860 Broadway, New York, NY 10003, U.S.A. 13.7 cm x 21.5 cm, 192 pages, illus., index, illustrated card covers. 1977. \$[US]2.00 from the publisher and from some dealers.

This paperback has been around since 1957 and has provided collectors with much useful and interesting information during that time. The book is abundantly illustrated but many of the illustrations, at least in the copy reviewed, are so dark that detail is lost.

In addition to the topics that you would expect to find, such as a brief history of the mails, stamp collecting equipment, a stamp identifying section and a classification of stamp types and their uses, there are many other interesting and useful sections. Some of these are: Condition of Stamps — a Precaution; Reprints — Forgeries — Fakes; Stamp Mixtures; Arranging Stamps; Most Valuable Stamps, Largest, Smallest and Oldest Stamps; Famous Collectors; Great Collections; Tycoons of the Stamp Trade; Philatelic Organizations, Philatelic Publications and a brief Philatelic Glossary.

In general, this is a book that a beginning collector could use to good advantage and would, no doubt, find interest in the notes on famous collectors and collections. However, he/she will find the sections on Philatelic Literature dated insofar as subscription rates are concerned. Similarly, the list of Philatelic Societies does not reflect the scope and number of societies that exist in the United States alone. The addresses of those listed should also be corrected, e.g., the R.P.S.C. address given has not been used for years.

EXCELSIOR, Summer 1977 [Vol. 5, No. 1, Whole No. 9]. Empire State Postal Historical Society, K. deLisle, Secretary-Treasurer, 54 Ramsey Place, Albany, NY 12208, U.S.A. 21.5 cm x 28 cm, 20 pages, illus., offset, paper covers, stapled. 1977. \$2.00 per copy from publisher.

The journal of the Empire State Historical Society begins with the tale of The Last Flag Cancel Machine by Harry Taber. He relates its first use in April 12, 1911 at Sidney, NY and states that it was used there until 1928. It was then sold to the

postmaster at Sidney Center, NY where it was used until May 27, 1941.

John Rice continues his major work on The Brooklyn Streetcar R.P.O. markings and identifies and dates some 44 varieties in 15 classifications. He includes data on the quantities of each.

The issue concludes with a continuation of a reproduction of a listing of Some Early Post Roads in New York.

Unfortunately, the quality of production of the journal does not match the quality of the articles. The typewritten copy is, for the most part, well printed but the illustrations, including the 1775 map on the cover, are very poorly reproduced. Copies of documents show too much background shading while stamps tend to appear as black rectangles.

FRANCE: A CATALOG OF ARTIST PROOFS, DE LUXE SHEETS, IMPERFS, COLOR ESSAYS, FIRST DAY COVERS by Edouard Cointreau. Stamps Information Associates, Inc., 156 State St., Boston, MA 02109, U.S.A. 21.7 cm x 28 cm, 20 pages, illus., photocopy, paper covers, stapled. 1977. \$[US] 6.00 from the publisher [add \$1.50 for airmail outside of U.S.A. and Canada].

"This catalog is only an attempt to price some of the special printings of the French Post Office." It is a list of prices, in dollars, for all items known to exist, based on retail prices and auction realizations. The three pages of illustrations or artist proofs of unissued essays and Post Office special charity issues are very poorly reproduced.

It is intended to make this a yearly publication. If so, the publishers should consider a more compact format and clearer illustrations.

When the first number of this new journal appeared earlier this year, it was indicated that publication would be irregular and would occur as sufficient material

came to hand. Response to the journal must have been better than expected because it is now said to be a quarterly journal.


Romanian collectors should be pleased to be able to get this publication which is devoted solely to Romanian philately. The printing is, for the most part, good but the illustrations, other than line drawings and markings, tend to be muddy. The illustrations in No. 3 show decided improvement and the map of Romania on the back cover of No. 3 is well reproduced.

The number of articles and notes in these numbers do not allow for a listing of them all. However, both feature a number of reviews of older literature on Romanian philatelic and postal history studies. No. 2 has George Pataki's article on "Postal Cards Not Listed and Not Illustrated in the Romanian Catalogue" as the lead article. No. 3 provides, among others, a two page excerpt from the "Romanian Postage Stamp Catalogue" on Watermarks of Romanian Stamps."

If you collect Romania, you should look into this journal.
